

Answer to Petrol Pouring Problem.



The first of the series at Ruapuna Park on 20th of October was won by Bert Hawthorne in his B.T. 21A Brabham, very hotly pursued by Ken Smith in the Lotus 41 with David Oxton hard on his tail who was followed closely by John Nicholson and Allan McCully, who was also Brabham mounted.

Competition Licences which are renewable by the Club may only be renewed by personal application at the Clubrooms. Only persons outside the Auckland metropolitan area may do so by mail.

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REPORT BY OUR EUROPEAN CORRESPONDENT BRUCE BLACKLOCK

Monday, September the 2nd and being a Bank Holiday the crowds gathered to see a day of Formula 3, Saloons and Sports Cars. The first race was Heat 1 of the Formula 3 event. Car 11 was the one to watch driven by a chap called Bill Stone of New Zealand. Unfortunately he didn't seem to have the handling quite sorted out, but still he qualified for the final, from which he retired with a bent wishbone after a bit of nonsense in Dingle Dell.

But the race everyone had come to see was the 50 Lap Event for the Sports Cars. Pole position went to Frank Gardner in the Lola T70, which is normally driven by Denny Hulme, with a time of 1-36-2. Next was Christ Craft in a Chevron - B.M.W. at 1-38-6, beside him was David Prophet in a Lola T70, Paul Hawkins (G.T. 40) and Alan Robinson (Chevron B.M.W.) filled the next row.

When the flag dropped Gardner took the lead and was never headed. Paul Hawkins had Chris Craft right on his tail and couldn't shake him off even though the Chevron was only 2 Litre against the 4-7 Litre of the Ford. On lap 28 Craft passed Hawkins and Ulf Norrinder had come up to fourth with his Lola T 70. Mike de'Udy also in a Lola clouted the bank at Clearways and retired with a battered sump. A few laps later Ron Fry spun and rolled his G.7.40 there also. Hawkins who had to be higher placed than Bill Bradley (Porsche 906) to win the championship rushed into the pits on lap 42 for a wheel change after puncturing a tyre. He lost a lap which he had no chance of regaining so Bradley although well down the field won the Championship.

The entry list looked fantastic to a Kiwi's eyes. Six Lola T.70's, Five G.T. 40's, Two Ferrari 250 L.M.'s, Eight Chevrons, Four Porsche 906's and Six Lotus Europus.

The second heat of the Formula 3 race was held in rain and caused several spins and prangs. The most spectacular being Mike Walker in the Chequered Flag McLaren when he shot straight ahead at Hawthorn's Corner, hit the bank, bounced back on to the track then spun round so as to block the corner. He was unhurt but the car was a real mess.

As the saying goes "To the Victor the Spoils", in this case how true.

Right from flag fall it was Victor, Victor, with the odd Ford. The Hawes-Leonard Victor led the race virtually from the word go and doing the whole race on one set of brake pads was a major accomplishment in-its-self.

The car which upset both Ford and Vauxhall were the two Datsuns driven by Anderson/Watson and Marwood/Innes. These cars didn't miss a beat during the whole event and finished 7th and 4th overall.

In the Classes the Hawes/Leonard won the over 2500 c.c. class; 1601 c.c. - 2500 c.c. - the sweet running Hillman Hunter left Triumph 2000's and a Peugeot 404 in its wake for a fine win; 1301-1600 c.c. the Datsuns of course - in fine style. The Marwood/Innes car suffered a leaking exhaust during the race - wonder if it was near the tuned length. 1001-1300 c.c. the Ford Escorts of Simpson/Nazer and Ross/Ross downed all opposition including last year's flying Morris 1100, now 1300 drivers - Hood/Draper. 0-1000 c.c. Simcas again with Emson/Bremner taking the gold, followed by the Harvey/Hamill car.

Well that's it. A good clean race (subject to scrutineering of course) which even had the crowd cheering on the last lap, finishing with Hawes/Leonard looking like they had just won the 24 Hours Le-Mans.



EXTRACTS FROM M.A.N.Z. CIRCULAR 26 SEPTEMBER 1968

N.Z. NATIONAL FORMULA:

The N.Z. National Formula for 1969/70 will be up to 1600 c.c., two valve per cylinder engines, unsupercharged maximum of 4 cylinders, 2 wheel drive, single-seat open wheel racing cars.

GOLD STAR RACING CHAMPIONSHIP:

The eligibility of cars for 1968/69 will be up to $2\frac{1}{2}$ litres, unsupercharged engines. Minimum prize money \$1000.

SCRUTINEERING LOG BOOKS:

Owing to the tendency for some competitors to conveniently lose their log books, particularly when an unfavourable comment has been made therein, Clubs are recommended and authorised to make a reasonable charge for any replacements requested. It is hoped by this action that would-be offenders will be deterred from the present malpractice.

SAFETY BELTS:

Further to my circular of 6 September 1968, the 21st Annual General Council recommend most strongly the wearing by drivers of a safety harness whilst competing and practising. The minimum harness recommended is a shoulder lap combination harness.


