

Bryce Platt Shellsport Saloon Champion

There have been times when I have been watching a dreary motor race and my mind has wandered to that slogan that you sometimes see on the rear window of motor cars "I'd rather be sailing". I have never been a boatie, but the thought of cruising through

the gulf on a keeler does seem to be attractive. But there are always two sides to a story and when I came to talk to club member Bryce Platt after he won this seasons Shellsport Saloon Car Championship, I found out that Bryce had traded his sails for the racing circuit.

Bryce used to sail a Paper Tiger Catamaran, but as Bryce puts it, he 'got sick of sitting out there on calm days going nowhere', so he turned to motor racing. Bryce has always been a regular club circuit driver. He started seriously in 1973 when he had his racing A40 Farina. The Farina was raced for two years and although it went well enough, it was never a contender for a championship. So the A40 gave way to the Ex-Murray Soames Escort and Bryce won the under 1600c.c. championship with the twin cam. In 76/77 the Escort was the open Clubmans Championship winner with the BDA engine. The saloon car regulations were about to be changed and when they came out the Platt team decided to have a go at the Shellsport Series.

Actually disaster struck long before the car got close to the first race. On the very last race of the Club Circuit season Bryce was running in the rain in a reverse-grid race when he got tangled with a V8 Escort. The Chequered Flag Escort, as it was then, finished its season in the ditch with the engine pushed under the firewall and many panels modified. Panelman and photographer Dave Hargreaves came to the rescue and he continues to be responsible for the cars good looks. Dave also helps to look after the publicity department with his photography efforts.

So from a rather sad looking club Escort, came the Skerry Escort, ready to do its first National Series. Bryce had managed to come by an English Brian Hart Twin Cam motor for the car. This engine had actually been used in Steve Millens 'old' Chevron that he raced in the Asian Series. The motor had sat on the wharf for twelve months and there were some hassles getting a licence to get it into the country officially. Needless to say the weather had not done much for the general condition of the unit either. Many people looked sceptically at the twin cam and wondered about its reliability. But Bryce has the services of a top motor mechanic in Randell Edgell and with money carefully spent on crack testing the top end of the

twin cam there were no problems at all. From 18 starts there were 18 finishes and only one rebuild. This year if the team had suffered a major blow-up, their racing would have been finished. Next season they will be in a stronger position as there will be an extra motor. The rest of the specifications include a four speed Rocket gearbox, ventilated Formula Pacific brakes all round with 9" wide rubber on the front and 10" on the rear on 13" rims. It is worth mentioning that Bryce always wears full fireproof clothing when he is racing, even at club circuit. Some members will remember the fire that Bryce had in the Escort at club circuit about 18 months ago. The fact that it is 'only' club circuit is no guarantee that there won't be an accident. Through some quick action, Bryce was lucky that he and the car came to no serious harm. Bill Leckie wasn't so lucky.

Bryce is 27 years old and is Production Manager at the family business of Skerry Knitwear. Two older brothers are also involved in the Mens Knitwear business and support the Platt team. But Bryce is actually a qualified engine rebuilder and did his time with John Nicholson. He is also a very active member of the Auckland Car Club being on the Executive and on the Race Committee. Prior to this years Shellsport Championship Bryce won the Club's Gymkhana Trophy back in '72 and a good second place in their class when he and Charlie Conway teamed up to race an RX2 in the Benson & Hedges.



Other than Randell Edgell and Dave Hargreaves, Keith Wilson, Kerry Bennett and Barry Nicol make up the rest of the team. Kerry is the Crew Chief and mechanic. He also supplies a home for the Escort in his garage. Keith does everything from checking tyre pressures to pitching the tent. Barry looks after the paper work and official side of things. The team were also helped last year by Shell, Union Travel and Champion. For 78/79 the Escort will be used to defend the title. There is also a plan to do the Benson & Hedges, probably in an Escort and probably with that hard charger from Australia Andrew Miedecke.

For those club circuit drivers who would like to move into the National scene, Bryce Platt has not only shown that it is possible, he has shown that you can move up and win. It is quite a feat to take on some on the countries top saloon car drivers and beat them first time out, but it can be done... Bryce proved it!

MANZ

ANNUAL GENERAL COUNCIL MEETING

Approximately 56 delegates representing Clubs affilliated to the Motorsport Association of New Zealand assembled at the Vacation Hotel, One Tree Hill on Saturday and Sunday 10th and 11th June for the Associations 31st A.G.M. The Business of the meeting included the presentation of the Annual Reports, the Balance Sheets, Statement of Accounts and election of Office Bearers for the ensuing year. A large number of other Club Members were admitted to the meeting as Observers, many of these people had also attended Race, Rally, Trials and Speed Advisory Committee meetings held on the previous Friday.

M.A.N.Z.'s total operating income for the year ended 31st December 1977 was \$82717. Of this amount Competition Licences contributed \$36396, Capitation Levies \$17060 and Organising Permits \$8000. Total Operating Costs were \$86960 leaving a deficit of \$4243 on the years activities. Annual increases in running costs (around 20% per annum over the last few years) is a matter for some concern. M.A.N.Z. Executive Members are aware of this problem and no doubt will continue to make strenuous efforts to keep the situation in check.

Several Executive recommendations as well as Remits submitted by Member Clubs were considered by the Council. Many of these were of a tidying up or machinery nature and will probably be reported on in a subsequent M.A.N.Z. Newsletter.

On the recommendation of the Executive a Special Levy of \$5 per entrant has been applied forthwith on all Rallies. It was reported to the Meeting that the Rally Organisers Association of N.Z. has for known reasons accumulated a cash shortfall and is unable to meet outstanding debts of some \$16000. R.O.A.N.Z. is a private company formed three years ago to organise the International Rally and co-ordinate the National Series. M.A.N.Z. has a 51% shareholding with the remaining 49% being held by a few Car Clubs. It is hoped that sufficient funds will be raised over the next year or two to enable M.A.N.Z. to assist R.O.A.N.Z. out of its current financial difficulties. Various changes to the adminstration and organisation of the International Rally have also been implemented which should improve the situation. Rally Licence holders have been circularised individually by M.A.N.Z. informing them of the decision.

A remit put by the Canterbury Car Club concerned propertional voting whereby in certain circumstances a poll could be demanded which would allow Club Delegates one vote per hundred members (based on his Club's Annual declared Membership). The intent is that larger (more than 100 member) Clubs with a correspondingly larger number of Competitor Members could gain more equal representation. As expected the remit was lost. Smaller Clubs fear that if such a system was instituted, the larger Clubs would control Motorsport generally, however, in practice it would be most unlikely to have this effect Most of these Clubs would continue to act as they have always done, in the best National interests of the Sport. It is interesting to note that more than half (38) affilliated Clubs have less than 100 members, and only ten have greater than 300.

Morrie Chandler was returned unopposed as President of the Association for a further term as also were the two Vice-Presidents, Keith Douglas and Robert Lester. In a show of confidence the election of Executive Members resulted in Jim Scott, Bill Forsythe and Isobel Boreham retaining office.



We are again deeply indebted to TISCO, and all our other sponsors, for their continued assistance on the event and I'm sure our claim of "New Zealand's richest car trial" was not made lightly, especially when only two competitors missed out on a prize of some sort. Eight of the 26 starters were Auckland Car Club entries and of these it is pleasing to see such a good effort for a relative newcomer in Roger Stewart, who finished 18th overall. The only real disappointment was the late protest lodged by a leading competitor, who as a matter of interest, has lodged protests on all three major events held so far this season. Perhaps we should introduce a 'Protestor of the Year' award.

Our next major trial after the Spring Invitation will be Rotorua, tentatively set for the weekend of 14/15 October, followed by the Experts Trial in November.

Recently I attended the MANZ AGM as the Clubs Trials Observer and the following major changes to Appendix T were passed and will become effective from the time of their publication in a MANZ Newsletter:

- Rule 18/4 amended by appending "except for closed club 1. trials of less than 75 kilometres at the Steward's discretion". This now permits intricate route finding in 50 km/h areas for such events, provided the Steward is happy with the areas and times of day etc. involved.
- 2. In Rule 26/3, the example "NO ENTRY" sign has been deleted, as it was felt that this could be confused by members of the public. It is also intended that "NO ROAD" and "PUBLIC ROAD" signs be phased out for the same reason, the former being replaced solely by the "X" sign.
- A new clause is to be added as rule 29/2 (Mapreading) as Follows: "At the beginning of all sections and/or subsections a grid reference and a direction in which the competitor is facing must be specified". This is common practice in this area anyway.

- 4. In rule 31/2, the time limit for lodging claims is to be reduced to 30 minutes, as per last year's rules. The time limit for protesting remains at 1 hour at this stage because of confliction with the NCR's.
- 5. The penalty for missing an unmanned check is to be amended back to its original 180 points. It was felt that the idea of reducing the penalty to 100 points, introduced several years ago (ie. to prevent "saturation trialling") had not been effective and, secondly, it was thought important that any competitors missing the same number of traps be penalised equally.

The new Trials Advisory Committee comprises:

Barry Higham of Christchurch John Neal of Hamilton Graeme Robertson of Auckland.

A Chairman has yet to be appointed from MANZ Executive.

The Committee's function is to consider and implement any changes felt necessary, but not essentially only at the AGCM. Anyone who is not happy with something in Appendix T should approach our Trials Committee and we can make representations at any time to Trials Advisory if necessary.

Finally, I would like to congratulate the Northern Sports Car Club for running an excellent Sporting Trial recently, although most of the fun was taken out of an incredible "special stage" type road by a slow competitor who was happy to plod along without pulling over, when about six cars were following, for quite some distance. I also don't agree with a competitor helping with results, especially when he ends up winning.

At a time when most motorsport teams are finding it difficult to attract sponsorship, the Woolf/Adams team managed to put together an excellent arrangement with Nylex Fletcher N.Z. (Ltd). Nylex are advertising their 'Roadster Vinyltop' products by sponsoring John Woolf's Mazda RX3 Coupe and Paul Adams Escort Mk2 1800. The RX3 was built up from a damaged car that John obtained during the summer months. The 13B engine develops around 200 hp. Adams Escort is the car that Paul had last year. It is now fitted with a 1760BDA engine with the head from Allan Woolfs BDG and a four speed rocket box. The Escort is also down on power compared with other front runners but so far both cars have proven to be very reliable with the drivers ability making up for some of the lost horsepower.

Naturally with Nylex as the sponsor, interior and exterior preparation has been as careful as the mechanical preparation. Both cars are painted black and are fitted with the new lace pattern white vinyl roofs. The interiors have been re-upholstered with the latest new nylex materials. Two Transits and two trailers are used to support the team. These vehicles are also painted in the Nylex colours and the transits have matching Vinyltop white roofs! The general appearance of the team is professional with the vehicles looking particularly clean and uncluttered as simple but effective signwriting has been used. Shell, Champion and Ferrodo have provided their valuable support.





The Vinyltop team have got off to a good start as far as competition results are concerned. Their first rally was the Cibie held at Maramarua. This was the shake-down event for the cars and both had minor troubles. Despite these, Paul Adams recorded a fifth place and John Woolf was ninth. Both drivers have close friends as their co-drivers. Grant Whittaker is now a veteran on many rallies with John's various Mazdas. Phil Dalzell works at Adams Products and is now getting a closer look at his bosses hobby. The drivers went it alone for the Rallycross. In the first round Paul came second and John third. In the second round of the series John got his revenge scoring a convincing win and gaining terrific television coverage, Paul suffered flooded electrics. Tokoroa brought a team managers dream as Allan Woolf was able to watch the new team clean-sweep the rally with John first and Paul second.





- Exhaust tubes, bends, flexible pipe
