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Editorial

This Newsletter provides details of, and background information about the Limited Edition Frontline Defence Services (FDS) Pack and Smart Phonecards. It is believed that these Packs were produced in 1999, so that the Australian Defence Forces (ADF) could advertise their FDS Smart Phonecards to Personnel at the various FDS Facilities not just in Australia, but also in various ADF overseas Facilities such as the ADF Mess in Dili, East Timor that was established in 1999. Furthermore these Packs had a Display Board Provision which also enabled them to highlight an FDS deployment that had previously occurred in Cambodia in 1992, Somalia in 1993, Irian Jaya in 1998, or Bougainville in 1998.

This Newsletter also provides information on the two types of the Kidney Foundation Kidney Kar Kard Packs that were produced and distributed in 1995. These Packs appear almost identical, and hopefully any reader of this Newsletter who has one of these packs and was not aware of there being two different pack types, will check their Kidney Kar Kard Pack to see what pack type they are missing.

The Editor so far has sighted four (4) of the less common Kidney Kar Kard LIMITED EDITION 1995 GABRIELE'S Packs with Pack Nos. 001, 003, 012 and 013, so there are definitely more of these packs around. The problem appears to have been that previously most collectors had not been aware of the existence of the GABRIELE'S Pack. Note that for every one (1) of the Kidney Kar Kard LIMITED EDITION 1995 GABRIELE'S Packs there were ten (10) of the Kidney Kar Kard 1995 Packs.

Similar to last month's Newsletter, the last article in this Newsletter provides images and details of the Telstra Payphone Phonecards, except this time the Phonecards have expiry dates between 30/04/2017 and 01/07/2025. The Editor is also investigating, and has proposed a de facto Combined Card Code Number system for the Telstra Smart Phonecards that were produced after 2003 without a Card Code Number printed on them. The proposed de facto Card Coding Numbers are structured using the data provided on these Phonecards to produce a logical chronological ordering of them to produce a Listing of them.

Limited Edition Frontline Defence Services Pack

There were 500 Limited Edition Frontline Defence Services Packs designed and produced by Price & Payne Advertising for Frontline Defence Services in late 1999. These Packs were sold only within Australian Military Facilities, and not to the General Public. However, Telstra did make quantities of these Frontline Defence Services Smart Phonecards, as detailed in Extract 1 on page 20 of this Newsletter, available to Collectors through Telstra Phonecard Collector Service.



Background to Frontline Defence Services Pack No. 058 of 500

Prior to August 1999, the United Nations in East Timor (UNAMET) was established, to oversee a referendum by the people of East Timor, also known as Timor Leste, for independence from Indonesia, with a small contingent of Australian military and Australian Federal Police personnel.

In August 1999, the people of East Timor voted overwhelmingly for independence from Indonesia, and consequently following this result, pro-Indonesian militias launched a violent campaign of destruction and displacement.

In September 1999, the United Nations (UN) authorised the establishment of a multinational force named the International Force for East Timor (INTERFET) to quell the violence, and requested that Australia lead it. This force consisted of around 5,500 Australian Defence Force personnel, and almost 5,000 troops from 22 other nations. INTERFET quickly secured the Capital of East Timor, Dili, disarmed the militias, protected aid workers, and established a defence line along the Western border with Indonesia.

The Frontline Defence Services Pack No. 058 of 500 was used in the Australian Army Mess in Timor Leste from late 1999 to advertise the Frontline Defence Services Phonecards that could be purchased to make phonecalls from the payphones on the Army Base.

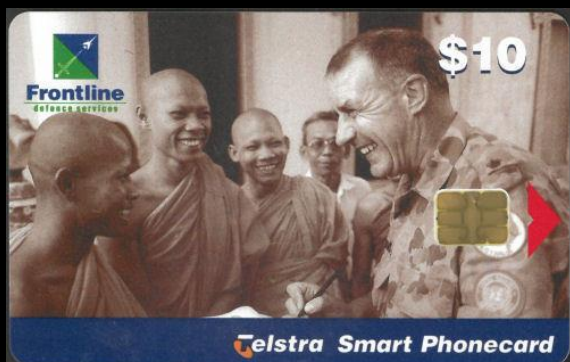

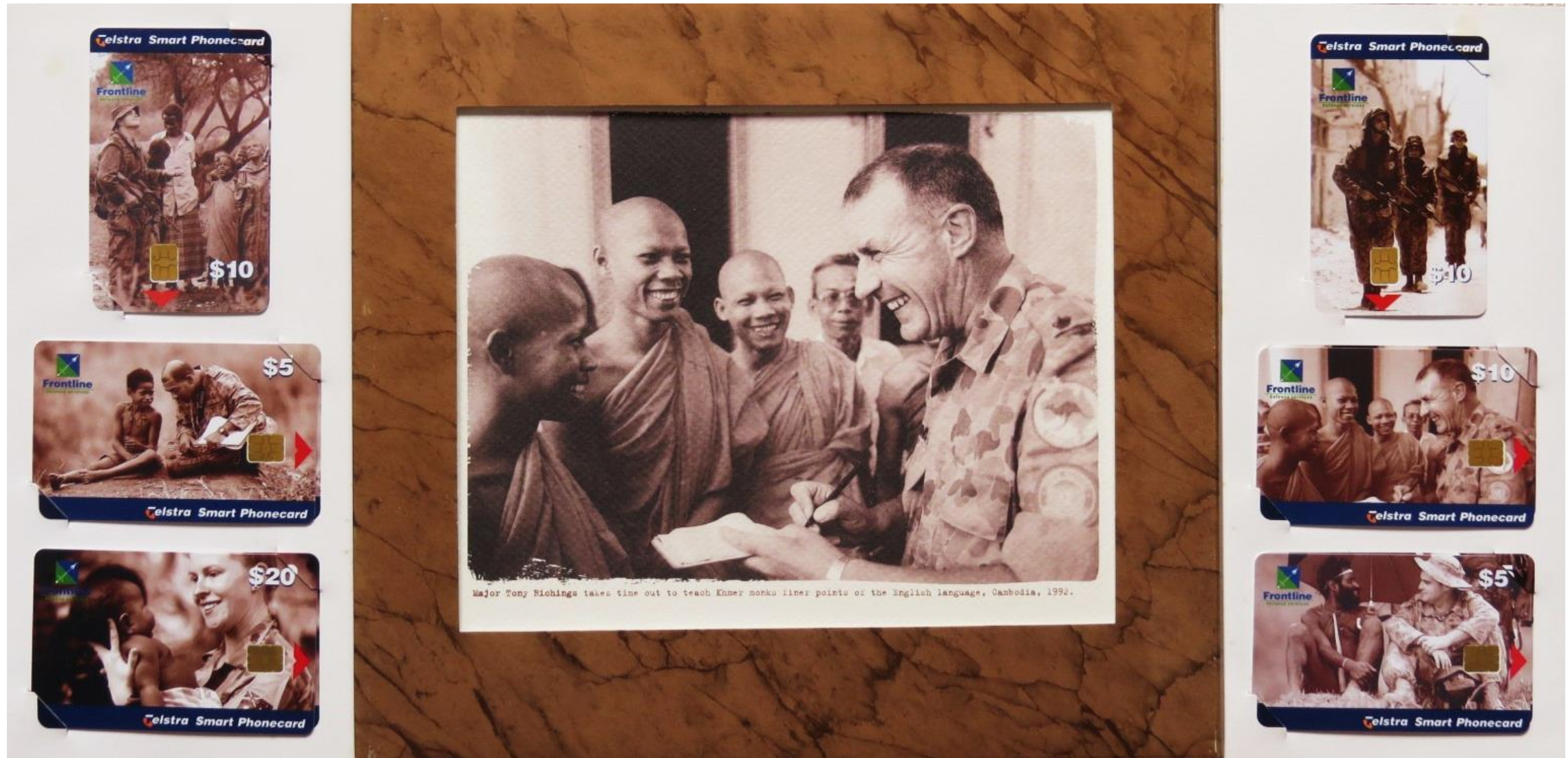

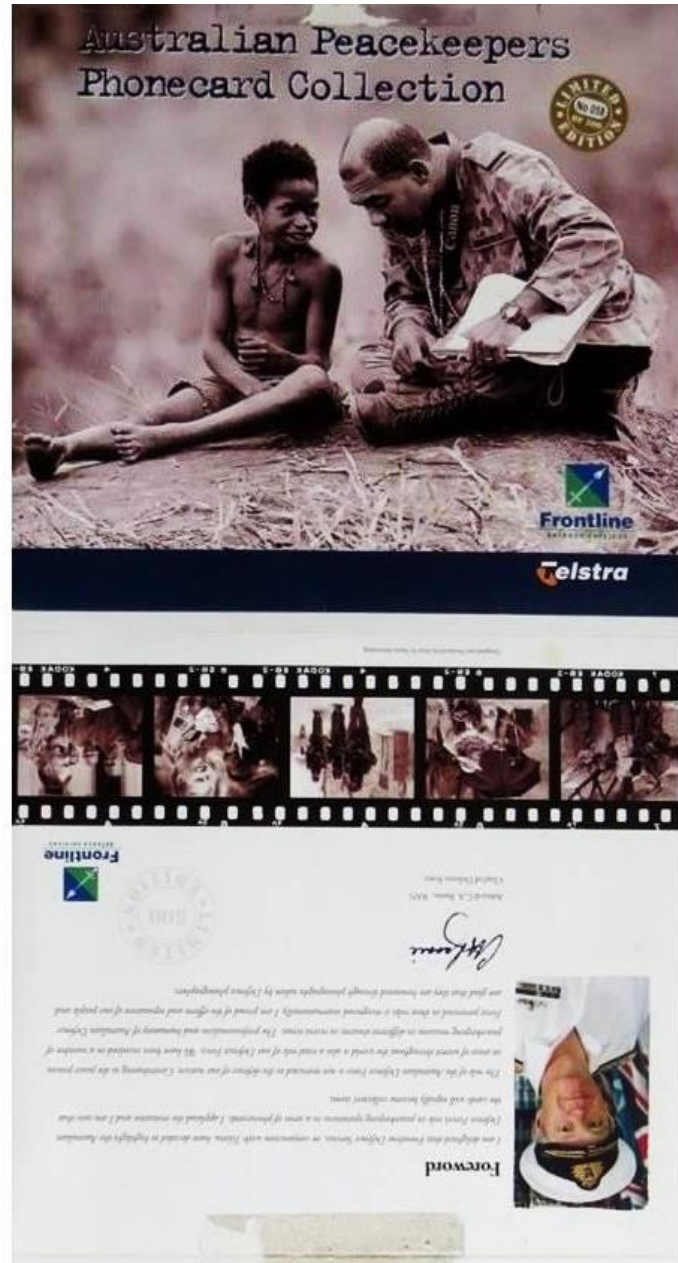

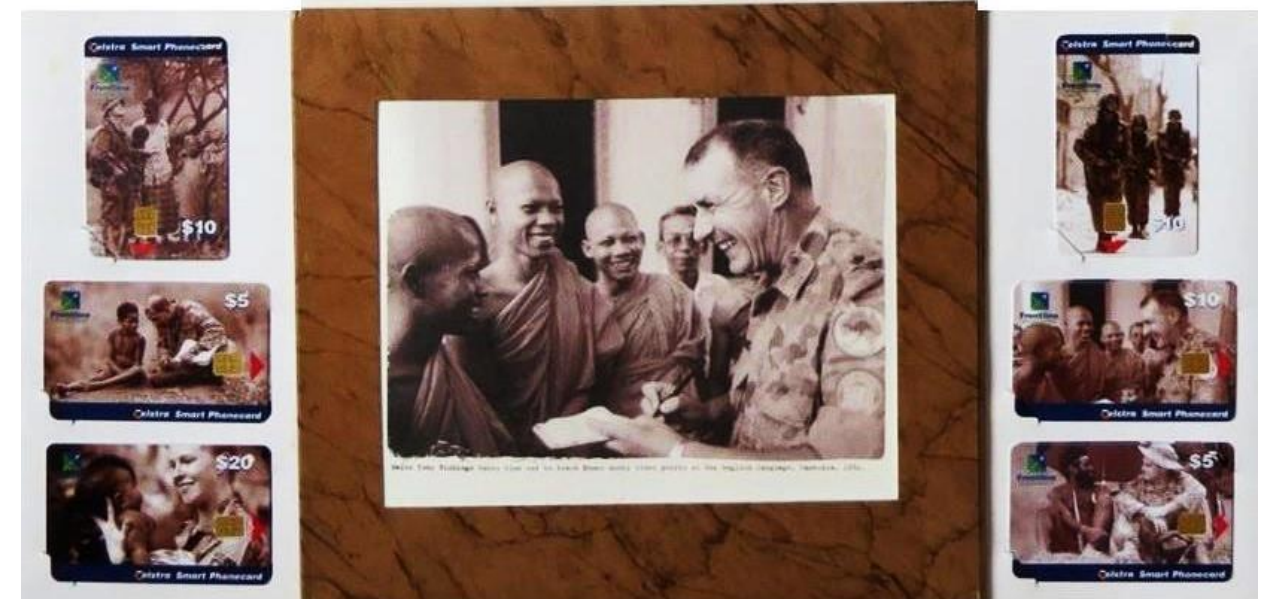

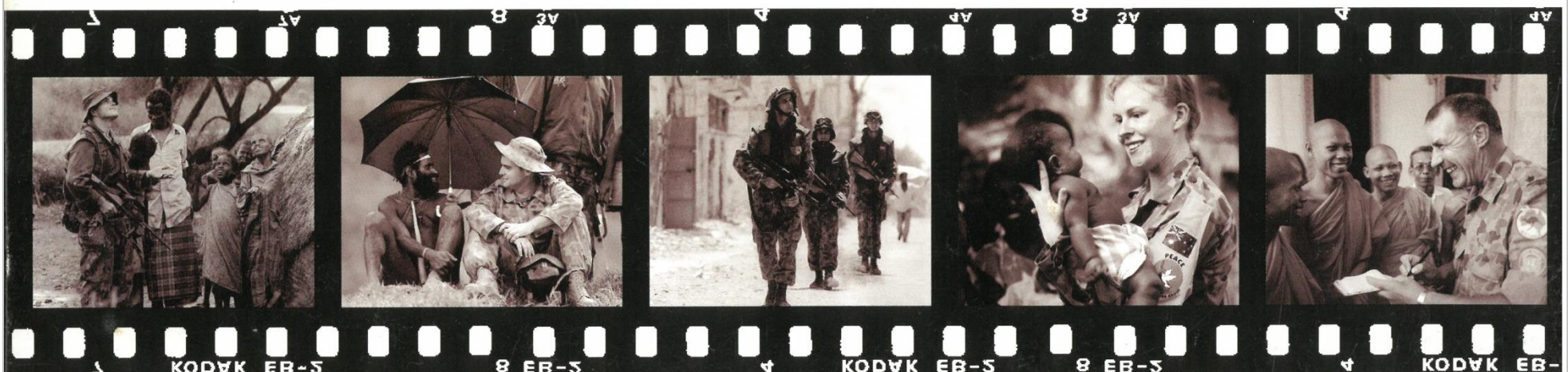


Foreword

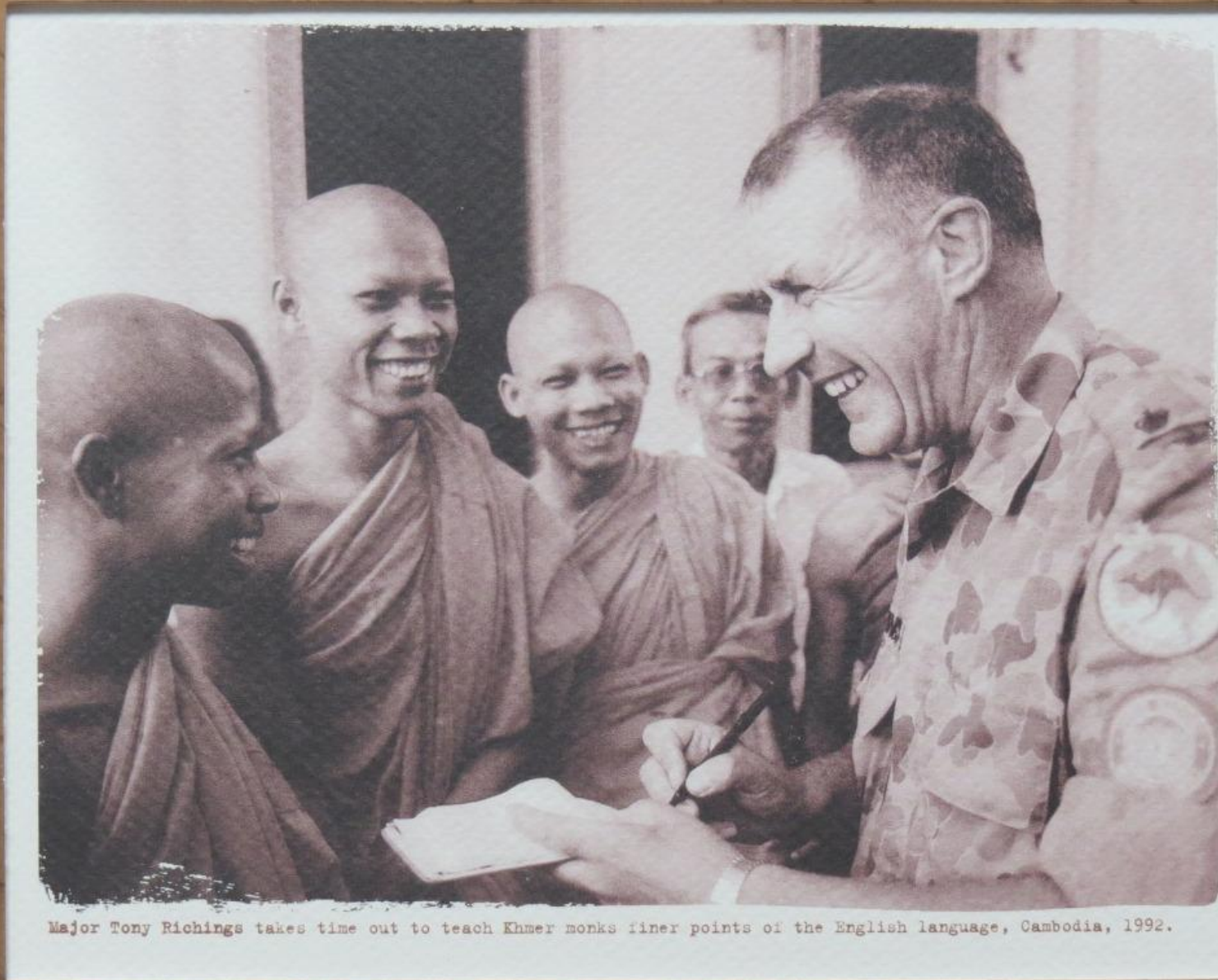

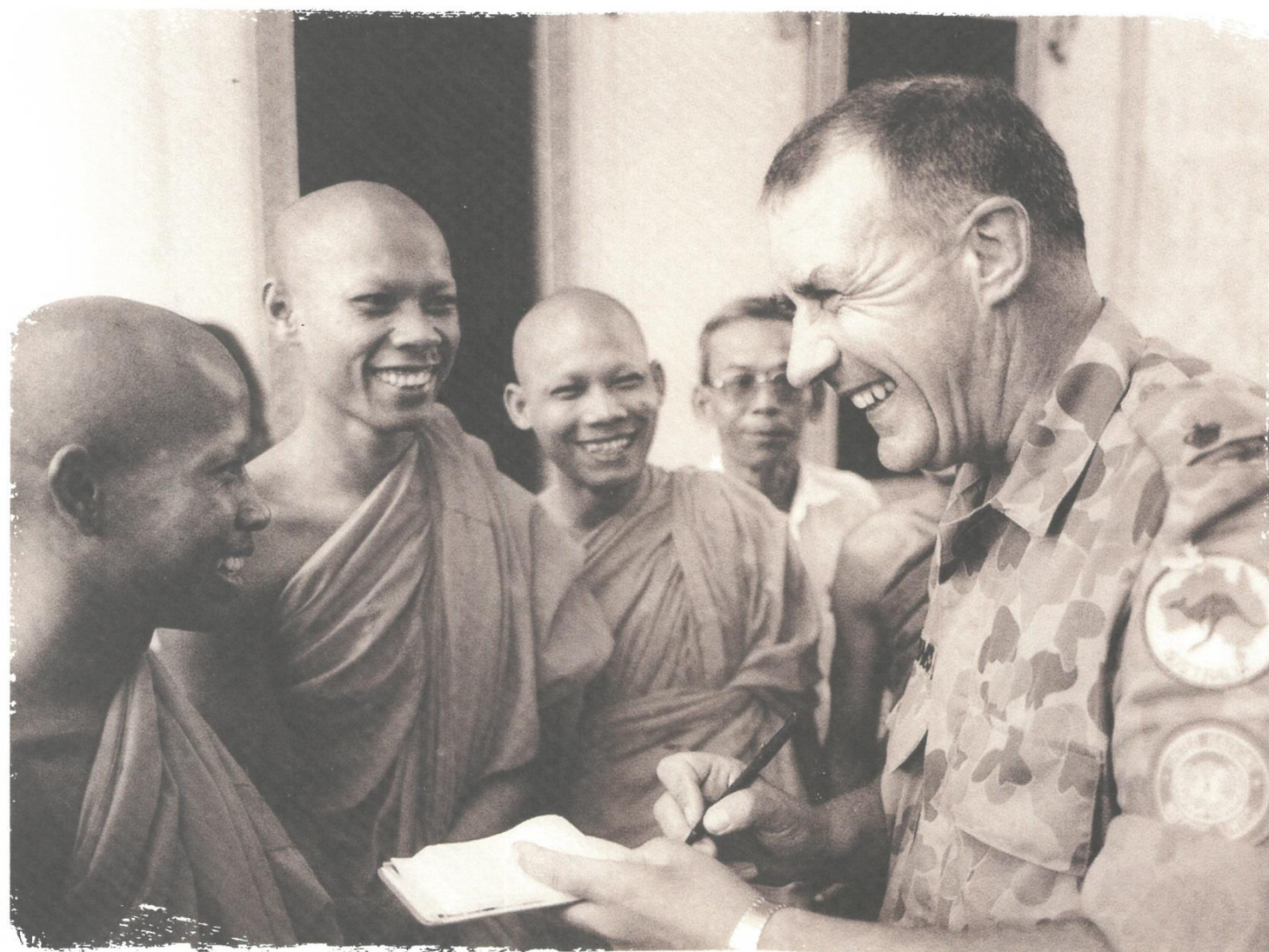

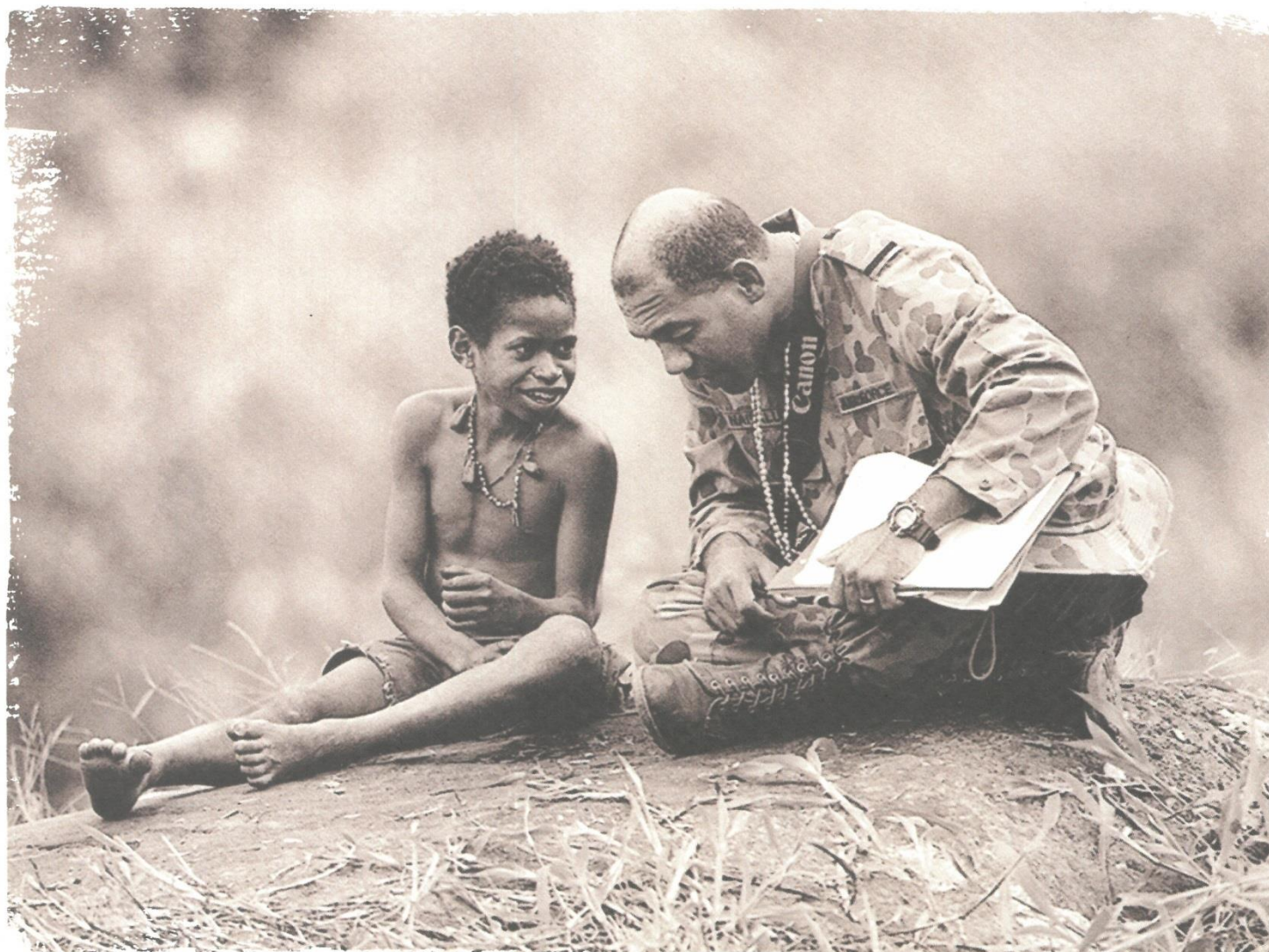

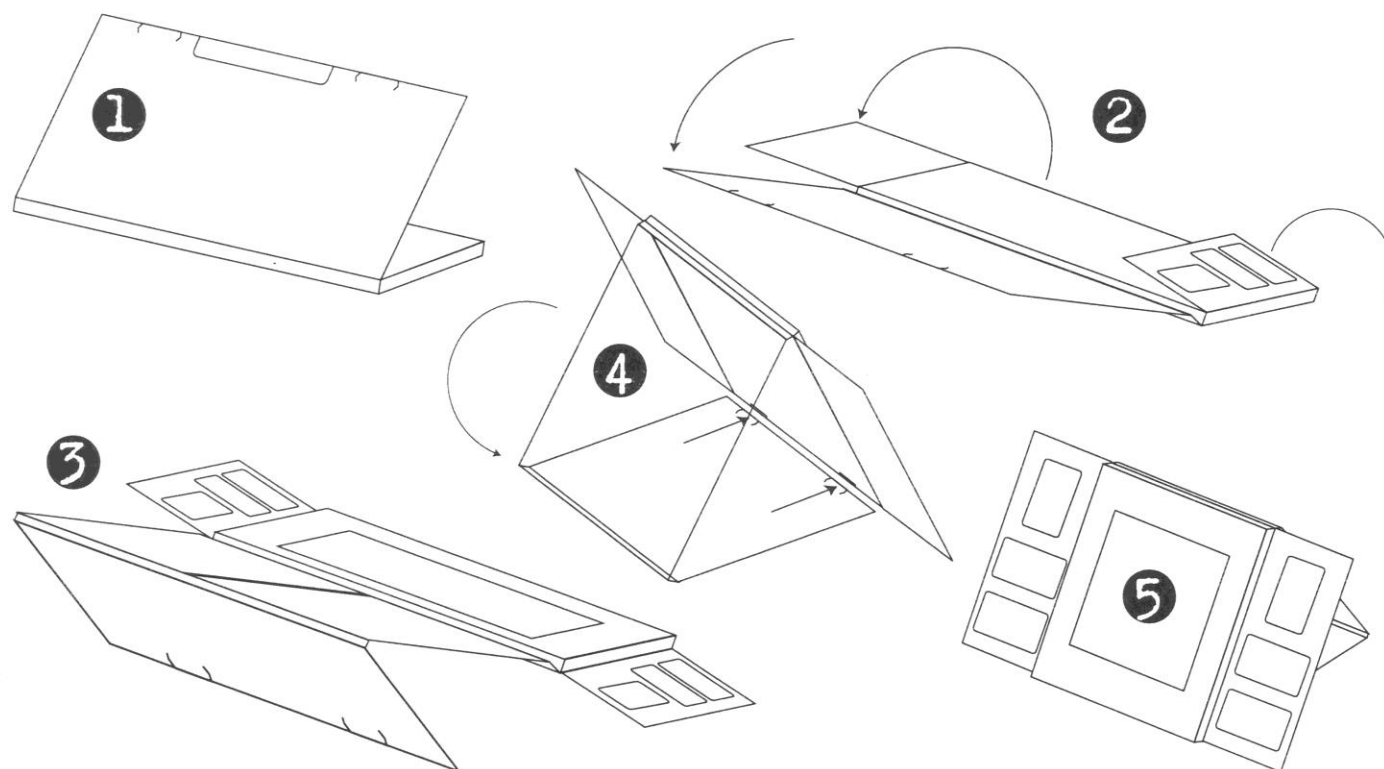

- the **Kidney Kar Kard LIMITED EDITION 1995 GABRIELE'S** Pack.

All Kidney Kar Kard Packs originally contained a Numbered "Win Pro Hart" Competition Entry Form which was matched to the Pack Number. However most unsold packs had these forms removed after the competition final draw on 26/8/95.

There were 5,000 of these Packs produced (See Advertisement below) with four (4) digit Pack Numbers ranging from 0001 to 5000, and these packs contained respectively phonecards with Serial Nos. ranging from 760 00001 to 760 05000. For example, Phonecard Serial No. 760 **03672** was matched to the Kidney Kar Kard 1995 Pack No. **3672**. This Pack also contains a "Win Pro Hart" Competition Entry Form with No. **3672**.

Kidney Kar Kard LIMITED EDITION 1995 GABRIELE'S Pack

There were 500 of these Packs produced (See Advertisement below) with three (3) digit Pack Numbers from 001 to 500, and these packs contained respectively phonecards with Serial Nos. ranging from 760 05001 to 760 05500. For example, Phonecard Serial No. 760 05**001** was matched to the Kidney Kar Kard LIMITED EDITION 1995 GABRIELE'S with Pack No. **001**.

Telstra Phonecards with Expiry Dates between 2017 and 2025

More Telstra Smart Phonecards with expiry dates between 2017 and 2025 have also recently turned up. From the information on these Phonecards it is possible to create De Facto Smart Phonecard Code Numbers for them, as can be seen under the Phonecards shown below. Furthermore the De Facto Code Number has been placed in brackets to indicate that it is a De Facto Code Number. These De Facto Phonecard Code Numbers have been structured in a logical chronological order of the Phonecards’ production Year, and Month as well as its \$-Value, all of which are provided on these phonecards.

(YYMM\$\$\$\$)

Where;

- YY is the last two digits of the year in which the Phonecard was produced,
- AA is the month of the year in which the Phonecard was produced, and
- \$\$\$ is the \$ Value of the Phonecard,

The format of the Combined Card Code Number is therefore **(YYMM\$\$\$\$) - Chip Type - Expiry Date**.

For example, the first card shown below, which is the \$10 Young People relaxing Phonecard, presently has a Combined Card Code Number of **(1412010) – C – 30/04/2017** which means:

- The card was produced in the year 2014 hence 14,
- The card was produced in the month of December hence 12,
- The card is encoded with \$10 worth of Phone calls hence 010,
- The card has the C Type Chip as defined at sergent.com.au/phonecards/aust/chipcards-intro.html, and
- The card has an expiry date of 30/04/2017.

The main advantage of having a logical and consistent Card Code Numbering system based upon data which is printed on the Telstra post 2003 Smart Phonecards is that it would enable all these Smart Phonecards produced post 2003 to be sequenced using a simple sorting routine into a chronological order.

Calling instructions:

Step 1: Insert card in the direction of the arrow with the gold chip facing up.

Step 2: Dial the number you wish to call for local, national, mobile and international calls from Australia.

If calls are made subject to GST, current rate of GST will be deducted at the time of call.

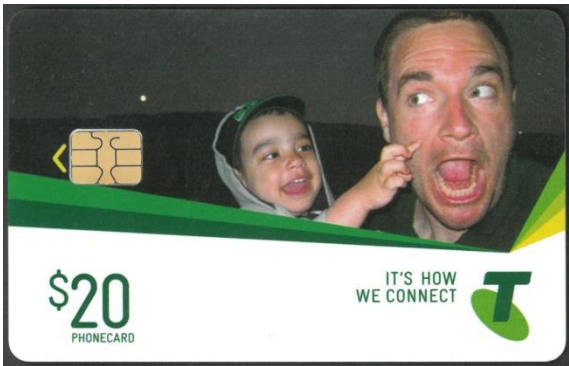

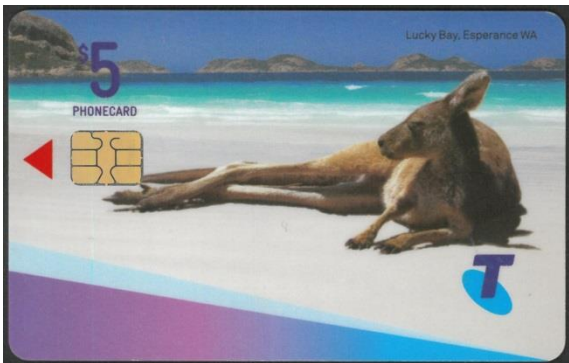
