





#### EDITORIAL

It is evident from this month's "Australian News Update" that Custom Cards are now truely 'upon us'. At the start of the month I thought that there would be three or four interesting cards/series to report on. By the end of the month, it was clearly evident that this was a most conservative estimate.

Some readers have asked as to why I do not produce a Telecom Prefix List anymore. The simple answer is that it is virtually impossible to provide information which is complete, accurate and up to date. I personally feel that if there are any prefix collectors left, they are to be complimented on their determined and persistent (obstinate?) nature.

When compiling the "Update", I intended to leave Telecom's Official Phonecard listing till last. Due to the increasing number of Custom cards being added to the list, I "ran out of space" - the "Update" being the second last page/s being typed (the Editorial being last). As such, I will briefly comment on the forthcoming Telecom cards in this Editorial.

The next issue contains a set of four cards promoting the 100th Anniversary of the Royal Life Saving Society, two \$5 cards, a \$10 and a \$20. These will be issued in September in both single units and packs. Telecom will be releasing a set of three cards for Christmas, a \$5, a \$10 and a \$20. For the first time, these cards will be available in a Limited Edition Pack. I have seen the proofs for these cards and personally feel that they are the most unflattering yet designed by/for Telecom. Comments made to me so far equate to the negative response to the design of the 1994 50 cent coin. Both designs focus on the "Year of the Family". Telecom has two further Advertising cards due for release. The first features Cardex '94, an International Phonecard Exhibition being held in Amsterdam early in September. Whilst 50,000 of these cards will be released, the interesting point is that 10,000 will be available in Amsterdam in a special package/folder - remember the Geneva card and folder? The second Advertising card features the "Bookmuncher", the recycling service offered through BP Service Stations for disposal of the White Pages Telephone Directories. A total of one million cards are to be released, commencing late September.

Please note, that as from now, <u>Telecom</u> has advised that their <u>Order Forms will no longer be published in this and similar magazines</u>. They will be obtainable only from Telecom's quarterly <u>Bulletin</u>.

What does all this mean. For a start, it means that this magazine will be going "full time" as from November of this year. The volume of phonecards being produced and the resultant demands on time to "chase up" relevant information for inclusion in the magazine, requires full time attention.

The result will be an increase in quantity in magazine content and with full attention devoted to its compilation, quality will also improve. I have chosen November as the appropriate time, this being the first month of my second year of publishing the magazine. It has been hard at times, but it has been published each month and I am pleased of this fact.

To celebrate the 1st anniversary, readers will note at pages 8 and 38, details of a \$2 Complimentary Card, which has been approved by Telecom, 10,000 of which are to be printed and distributed as 'giveaways' with subscriptions to this magazine.

Finally, I must apologise to all those readers whom have contacted me in relation to the Qantas card. My comment in the last issue re my obtaining "surplus stock" was in jest - something that backfired, as evidenced by the letters and phonecalls received seeking this card. No more 'backhanded jokes'.

#### LETTER TO THE EDITOR

There has been considerable speculation recently in relation to the "rise and fall" in prices for New Zealand Collector Packs. Everyone has a view on what has transpired, why, and what the future holds for New Zealand. Following discussion between myself and Robert Gill of Strategic Media Limited (the producers of Telecom NZ Collector Packs), Mr Gill wrote to me to outline to myself and readers, his views of the New Zealand PhoneCard situation and its future. This letter is reproduced as follows. - Editor.

Dear Sir,

#### Re: The New Zealand Market

Many thanks for the opportunity to have a talk with you via the phone today in relation to the current market situation in New Zealand.

It is certainly fair to say that the New Zealand market has gone through over the last 3-4 weeks a price correction which was certainly overdue as far as the Telecom New Zealand collector packs are concerned.

The price in the secondary market had reached such substantial heights that there was little profit left in the product for people to be continuing to purchase at these top end prices and then for them to be able to realise any type of financial gain at the other end. This therefore put some pressure on to bring prices down to ensure the ability for all participants to be able to buy and sell product in the market.

The New Zealand dealers, I believe, have responded to this and in doing so, the price correction will allow for the market to continue to enjoy growth not only in those collector packs we issued in the past but also to ensure a continued success of the new product being released.

The market has reduced down approximately 30% literally across the board for collector packs; so in saying this, many products still return phenomenal results over their issue price and to prove this point, I have accompanying this communication a series of graphs that demonstrate the collector pack issue prices versus the current secondary market prices over the 1992, 1993 and 1994 years. (Due to page constraints these graphs could not be re-produced in this issue. See next month - Ed.)

I have also despatched to you graphs that show the averaged annualised return or increase over the issue price for each of the 1992, 1993 and 1994 years.

If you were to average those as one of the graphs does, you will see that the average annual return over the two and a half years we have been issuing

collector packs is 360% per year. This is based on the new prices after the market correction.

Equally, it is fair to say that every market will experience ups and downs and certainly the Telecom Auction that we staged, drove prices to a point that were well beyond the reach of most PhoneCard collectors and/or investors.

It is also important that you and your readers understand some of the key facts in regard to New Zealand as opposed to the scene in Australia.

These facts are:-

1. The New Zealand Market has been used to paying premiums for collector sets and single cards since we developed the Telecom PhoneCard collector market.

In Australia, premiums are not paid for your Telecom issued packs other than a \$4-\$7 charge over and above face (slightly more now-Ed).

Also, our collectors are used to receiving substantial returns on their collections which are currently not yet being recognised in the Australian market.

2. The New Zealand market has a very substantial collector base given the population. For example, we currently need 11,800 collector sets if we were to supply the number that everybody is requesting.

In addition to this we would require a further 3,500 to satisfy our dealer demands.

Currently we have only been issuing 4,000 sets but are now about to move up to 5,000 - 6,000.

Therefore, there is obviously a substantial difference between the amount of product we are putting into the marketplace and the huge demand.

We also have over 3,500 people on our list waiting to become a standing order customer and this grows by 40 - 50 per day.

Therefore, for anybody to be reporting or talking about the market being depressed, turned downward or collapsing in New Zealand is non sensical.

In addition to the above waiting lists, we also have a list of over 30 people applying to be major PhoneCard dealers in New Zealand on top of our current network.

This when you look at the hugely successful international product launch we have just done for the international collector sets and the fact that we now have orders exceeding 5,000 units per issue of our international product on top of the numbers I have indicated above, you start to see what a huge demand there is existing around our product.

Most people fully understand that a 360% average return per year over the last two and a half years is an incredible investment achievment and certainly gives both the Collector Service and the product a substantial position in the market and also substantial credibility.

Going into the future, we are also going to be running over October and November 1994, three major regional auctions in Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch, that will again move the market forward as well as implementing a buy and sell service to all of our customers and a major bimonthly PhoneCard magazine which the Collector Service will be producing as an information and educational booklet going out to the 16,000 names that we have on our list.

The Collector Service will be undertaking advertising in major publications in Australia and also in America and the International Telecard Collector Magazine out of the United Kingdom.

Further we will be attending major Fairs around the world and undertaking major direct response marketing campaigns in certain markets.

In summary, we have not even started yet to develop the success of the New Zealand PhoneCard collector packs and the PhoneCard market. The returns collectors and investors are going to receive into the future will, we think, be spectacular indeed. If you require any further information, please do not hesitate to contact me.



#### PAYTEL PHONECARD FRAUD

Three different incidents involving PayTel phonecards have been brought to our attention during the past fortnight. PayTel considers them to be extremely serious and we have made contact with the Victorian Police Fraud Squad who will be instigating an investigation in the near future.

The first was a Sydney collector who purchased what he believed to be an "Abel Tasman" collectors pack and which turned out to be a card set fitted to a PayTel phonecard holder. The set was packed in a white envelope which was numbered and sealed with the small "Australian Made" logo sticker. Outwardly it appears genuine. The collector had two other "Abel Tasman" genuine packs and rang us to enquire whether we had two different type of card holders for that original set.

Please be aware of this fraud. Before purchasing any "Abel Tasman" packs, carefully prise open the sealing sticker and ensure that there is a genuine pack inside.

The second was a person in Melbourne who approached a dealer at the recent Coin Fair selling a "Wilderness Rivers" card printed in strange colours. This incident was repeated in Sydney when a person called on a Sydney dealer.

These cards are part of a rejected print run where the printing press colours "went wrong". We instructed that all these cards be destroyed and in fact supervised the destruction - but obviously a small number escaped.

These cards are not genuine, have no mag stripe and there must be only a very few in existence.

Many thanks to the dealers who reported these activities to us. We are doing everything within our power to put a stop to these fraudulent actions and will take the appropriate legal actions based on the results of the Fraud Squad investigations.

#### "SURPRISE CARD"

The Toyota card pictured below caught "everyone" by surprise when it appeared with NSW resellers late in August.



It is a Telecom "Advertising" card (prefix no. 557) and has been printed in a run of 30,000 of which 10,000 will be available through Telecom's Collector Service (wait for the Bulletin) and 20,000

available (at face value) through resellers only in NSW. At the Edlin's Phonecard, Stamp and Coin Show in Sydney on the weekend of 27-28 August, the card was selling for \$15.00.

This card should be in demand with collectors and dealers, particularly in states other than NSW.

#### AUSTRALIA'S FIRST DISNEY PHONECARDS

Phillip Jones from Melbourne, commissioned local designer Mick Sowrey to design a set of two Telecom Australia Phonecards and an A4 size Wallet, featuring those two well known Walt Disney characters, Mickey Mouse and Donald Duck. The cards and pack feature 'Mickey and Donald Down Under' with two strikingly colourfull, \$2 Custom cards. The theme is uniquely Australian; Donald is pictured with Ayres Rock in Central Australia in the background whilst Mickey is featured on a surfboard riding the brilliant blue surf. (See magazine cover).

To achieve the affect and high quality required for the presentation pack and cards, the images were proofed many times before the final result was achieved. **Mick Sowrey** used a combination of Disney produced images, original hand drawn illustrations and computer generated graphics.



The proofs suggest that the final product will be stunning - even by the most exacting Disney standards. It is expected that an exhibition will be staged before Christmas showing all the design stages involved (complete with original illustrations, rejected designs and proofs). Only 10,000 Limited Edition collector sets will be available (in late October) and no reprints will be made at any time. Status Stamps in Sydney will be handling the distribution and sale of these cards and they can be contacted by phone on (02) 2676116.

This company has a \$2 giveaway card featuring its Lanolin beauty products.

The second and third cards in the AFL series have now been released. Telearch is also to release two cards featuring the Melbourne Zoo.

## NORFOLK ISLAND FOENKAADS

Formed approximately three millenium ago at the same time as Pitcairn Island, Norfolk Island, two hours east of Australian by plane, remained uninhabited until the late 18th Century. Now it is a tourist destination offering boutique shopping, fine cuisine, golf, fishing and water sports as

well as beautiful beaches.

At that time, it became a place of refuge for the descendants of the "Bounty" mutineers. Ultimately, the Pitcairners, many of whose forebears had escaped transportation to Norfolk as convicts, found themselves its owners.

Three inaugural Phonecards to be issued by Norfolk Island in October celebrate this amazing story. The cards depict three scenes:-

- . the famous ship the "Bounty"
- . Bounty Day, and
- . Kingstown.

These cards will be issued in Australian Dollars, in denominations of \$5.00, \$10.00 and \$20.00. They will only be able to be used on Norfolk Island itself. Their primary purpose is to enable the thousands of tourists who visit Norfolk Island annually to make international telephone calls in the recently installed Cardphones on the island.

#### \$5.00 Kingston

The Norfolk Island founding party was dispatched from Port Jackson, New South Wales, on the vessel "Supply" on 15 February, 1788, under the command of Lieutenant Philip Gidley King. The "Supply" arrived off Norfolk Island on 28 February, 1788. Lieutenant King had to wait five days in the lee of the island before he could lead a scouting party ashore at Anson Bay on the 4th of March. He found passage through the reef at Sydney Bay and landed the convicts and supplies on the 6th of March.


Sydney Bay later became known as Kingston and it is Kingston that is depicted on this attractive card.

In 1790, "Supply" was to again sail, this time with "Sirrius" to the penal colony of Norfolk Island, the latter carrying 281 people. "Sirrius" met her end on a reef off Norfolk Island. Fifty Five days earlier the "Bounty" had been burnt off Pitcairn Island.

#### \$20 Bounty


On 23 December, 1787, His Majesty's Armed Transport "Bounty" left England with a crew of 44 men under the command of Lieutenant William Bligh. The ship was bound for Tahiti from where she was to take a cargo of breadfruit plants to the West Indies.

The "Bounty" was not a large vessel, being only 28 metres (just over 90 feet) in length and 215 tons burthen. She had been modified to accommodate the breadfruit plants by converting the great cabin (below decks) into a 'garden' for them, complete with a complicated system of water pipes and drains.



Due to the ship's size and the modifications made to it, there was no room for any marines on board; in fact, there was to be no commissioned officer apart from Bligh. This meant that the task of maintaining discipline fell to him alone.

Early in September, 1787, Mr Fletcher Christian signed on as a member of the "Bounty's" crew. Noone could have foreseen how a quarrel between these two men would affect the fate of all on board and impact dramatically upon the future of Norfolk Island.

The journey from England to Tahiti was a most unpleasant one, the "Bounty" eventually arriving at Matavai Bay on 26 October, 1788, after a voyage of 27,086 miles (44,421 kilometres) in dangerous and difficult conditions.

The Tahitians were friendly and welcoming. Lieutenant Bligh had little difficulty in coercing one of the chiefs, Tinak, into allowing him to establish a nursery garden where young breadfruit saplings were transplanted into pots to be ongrown before commencing their journey to the West Indies. The work was easy. Released from their routine on the "Bounty", it seems that the crew grew soft, doing little other than playing games, eating and indulging in love-making.

The tropical dream came to an end on 4 April, 1789, when the "Bounty", with 1,000 breadfruit plants aboard, sailed for the West Indies. By this time, it should be appreciated that Christian had formed a strong relationship with the chieftan's daughter, Mauatua, whom he had renamed Isabella; indeed, he may have married her and it is possible that two further crew members had married Tahitian women whom they were to leave behind.

When he set out from Tahiti, Bligh anticipated a fearful voyage and a fearful voyage it was. The discipline of the crew had all but disappeared.

In the twent-four days before she was taken by the mutineers, the "Bounty" sailed through the Leeward Islands of the Society Group, touched at the Cook Islands and anchored off one of the Tongan group, Nomuka, where she purchased provisions. From there, she sailed in a westerly direction to the south of Tofua, it being intended to travel toward Endeavour Straight, north of Australia.

Just before sunrise on 28 April, 1789, with Tofua thirty miles to the north-east, the mutineers siezed the ship. It was a bloodless mutiny led by Fletcher Christian. Bligh and those loyal to him were cast adrift in the ship's launch with food and provisions. Christian set sail initially for Toobouai, an island south of Tahiti, subsequently onto Tahiti, and thereafter in search of a safe haven in the Pacific which he ultimately found at Pitcairn Island, sighted on 15 January, 1790. The "Bounty" was stripped of all that was moveable and then set alight on 23 January, 1790.

At about the same time, Bligh was arriving back in England to seek revenge.

#### \$10.00 Bounty Day

By the late 1840's the colony founded by Fletcher Christian on Pitcairn Island had grown considerably in size. The Pitcairners were finding it hard to survive. The tiny island they inhabited was becoming unable to support them. After some initial resistance by a minority of the Pitcairners, on 3 May, 1856, the entire Pitcairn community of 186 people sailed for Norfolk Island aboard the vessel "Morayshire". She arrived at Norfolk Island on 8

June, 1856. The day of their landing was the anniversary of the day that the "Bounty" was commissioned.

Each year since, the Norfolk Islanders have celebrated Bounty Day be re-enacting the landing, attending a communal picnic, and finishing off with an old-fashioned ball. This card depicts a feature of that celebration.

The association with the famous "Mutiny on the Bounty" should be enough to ensure the immediate appeal of these cards. But if more were needed, it is there!

The cards will have instructions for their use printed on their back in both Norfolk and English. Norfolk is a combination of 18th Century West Country English and 18th Century Tahitian. The Norfolk word 'Foenkaad' (pronounced foo-en-card) will appear on the front.

The cards, which are a Telstra issue for the Norfolk Island Administration, are useable in Card Phones on Norfolk Island only.

The set of three mint cards will be available to collectors at face value of \$35 whilst the Collector Packs will be available at \$45.00 each plus a handling fee. (Note advert on page 13). No further details about costs are available at the time of completing this article.

It is understood that the Administration of Norfolk Island, through the Norfolk Telecom Foenkaad Bureau, intends in the future, to make only three or four issues per annum.

## NEW ZEALAND UPDATE

#### **NEW ZEALAND MARKET NEWS**

Over the last 2.5 years the average investment return on NZ Collector Packs has been 328% per annum. This figure is based on retail prices at 26 August, 1994. Over the last few weeks the pricing on Collector Packs has reduced by about 30-40% from the incredible post auction highs (of 13 June) to a far more realistic level. Whilst there has been a reduction in pack price levels, existing prices are still above those that were established before the auction.

Telecom currently have orders for 11,200 packs of which they will soon be producing 6,000 for each issue. The maximum, before the end of the year, is expected to be around 7,000.

Telecom New Zealand are now publishing buy/sell prices for Collector Packs in the National Business Review (a weekly business/financial paper).

AdCards are the best sellers at present and it has become clear that no one has any large holdings of the earlier cards. There will be many AdCards coming out in the next few months and I expect that collectors will start becoming more selective to what they buy and only obtain the cards that appeal to them thematically.

#### TELECOM NEW ZEALAND NEWS

Telecom's issuing policy has been amended. The \$5 AdCards must now be produced in minimum print runs of 15,000 whilst \$20 AdCards must be produced in minimum runs of 3,500.

Telecom is setting up a new agreement with dealers. There will now be three types of dealers:-

- . General Dealer
- . Accredited Dealer Level 1
- . Accredited Dealer Level 2.

Basically, the differences are that an Accredited Dealer is only allowed to sell Telecom products (no private overprints or PAYCELL cards etc.) There are also different discounts available to Level 1 and Level 2 dealers, depending on how much stock is purchased.

Telecom will be producing a catalogue during October. It will feature all cards issued up to the 30th of June, 1994. Telecom will also produce annual updates of this catalogue. In addition, they will also be producing a bi-monthly Collector News Magazine.

International Collector sets are now available through PACS in Australia. Telecom have orders for 4,000 sets. From the next pack onwards (Black Music Legends) not only will the packaging be different but the cards will be overprinted on the reverse with "International Collector Issue", instead of "Collector Issue".

Telecom will be staging three auctions in the main centres of New Zealand (Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch) over the next few months. They will also be producing a \$2 PhoneCard for each of the auctions. Only 1,000 of each card will be produced and "given away" with large purchases.

Telecom have set up a new Buy and Sell Service for collectors and dealers. A letter will be sent to them and they can indicate which product they wish to buy and the maximum price they want to pay. Likewise with the sell aspect, except the collector or dealer will mark the minimum price they will accept. Telecom then match up the people with like values and take a 7.5% commission for doing so.

#### AMERIVOX IN NEW ZEALAND

AmeriVox has produced their first New Zealand "theme cards". They consist of a set of four US\$5 cards produced in a Collector Pack (only 1,000) issued to commemorate the Whitbread, Round the World Yacht Race.









#### STRATEGIC MEDIA LTD

Strategic Media have announced that they will be "packaging" Australian Custom cards for producers for presentation in a New Zealand pack format. It is anticipated that Strategic Media will have 3-4 such Collector Packs coming out over the next 4-6 months. It is proposed that some 1,000 of these packs will be marketed in New Zealand and the balance of 500 will be available in Australia. Strategic Media is also negotiating with Fiji Post and Telecom in relation to packaging their cards (including official releases) in New Zealand packs. Continued on page 18......

totalled 6,000 and International Collector Packs 3,000.

Whitcoulls Fathers Day - Based on the popularity of their two Mothers Day cards earlier in the year, Whitcoulls have produced a second combination greeting card and PhoneCard to celebrate Fathers Day. A total of 24,500 cards were produced in July, 7,000 of which were in NZ Collector Packs and 4,000 in International Packs.

South African Rugby Tour - A set of two cards were commissioned in July by Kiwi Phonecard International to commemorate the tour of New Zealand by South Africa in 1994. A total of 12,500 of design 1 and 23,000 of design 2 were produced, of which 6,000 were placed in NZ Collector Packs and 3,000 in International Collector Packs.

Ranfurly Shield Series - August saw the release of a series of eight cards commissioned by Shell, representing the highlights from Ranfurly Shield (Union) matches over the past decade. A total of 24,500 of each design were released of which 7,000 are in NZ Collector Packs and 4,000 in International Packs.

Air New Zealand - August saw also the release of a set of four cards featuring some of the aircraft produced by Air New Zealand to service their routes. 19,500 of each design were produced with 7,000 placed in NZ Collector Packs and 4,000 in International Packs.

Missing You - September sees the release of 27,500 cards produced as a combination greeting card and PhoneCard by Telecom Payphones. 8,000 will be in NZ Collector Packs and 6,000 in International.

Animal Eyes - Following their very successful "Critters Series", Pacific Coin Company have now produced a second animal series, "Animal Eyes". A total of 14,500 of each of the five designs have been produced with 7,000 in NZ Collector Packs and 4,000 in International Packs.

## THE GRAPEVINE

## by Insider

New Zealand has experienced a sudden drop in prices on the secondary market for Telecom New Zealand's PhoneCard Collector Packs. Over the last 4-5 weeks, prices have taken a tumble of up to 40%. Dealers report to me that sales are very slow now and when I tried to sell some NZ packs, they were not interested. As with most stock market type situations the faster the prices increase the faster and deeper the following depression becomes. The similarities between the New Zealand scene over the last 12 months very much resembles the closing stages of a long-run cycle in the stock market. In the closing 12 months of such a cycle, investors and speculators reach "fever pitch" with regard to buying (speculating frenzy). This is because "good buys" are running out and with little to find that is really worthwhile, they try and find that extra profit in what is already expensive. This situation starts to feed off itself and so everyone gets into thinking that these expensive items are always going to get higher and higher in price. After the last stock market crash prices remained subdued for the next five years. I hope that the collector base in New Zealand is strong enough to produce normal market behaviour within a shorter time frame than this.

Prices seem to have been paired back to levels existing just prior to <u>the</u> auction held back in June, just some eight weeks ago. Prices took off due to <u>that</u> auction much to everyone's surprise and amazement at the time and it now seems that the price rises were based on nothing more than the desire of speculators wanting to make a quick profit.

Unfortunately, these events will mean that the situation does not just go back to the June events as if nothing else happened. Rather the NZ scene is most likely destined to a fairly unexciting period ahead with regard to price rises for Collector Packs. The good point is that collectors will now be able to purchase items for their collection at a leisurely pace rather than have to hurry "before the price doubles".

Only six weeks ago, I was lamenting the fact that I was not on NZ Telecom's mailing list and so could not obtain these "golden eggs" at issue price which could then be on-sold at a huge profit only two months later. At that time there was a waiting list and it was closed. I imagine that the situation may have changed and that anyone interested in collecting these attractively designed packs could probably now get onto the list and so obtain new releases at issue price.

If we assume that there are only one quarter the number of collectors in New Zealand as in Australia then the price on an issue of 1,000 should correspond roughly to the price of an issue of 4,000 for an Australian item. The items that have this sort of issue quantity would be the Collector Packs for South Australia, Queensland and Victoria for example and so these packs (if priced to New Zealand pre-price adjustment levels), should sell around the \$3,000-\$5,000 mark!!!

It is highly unlikely that these packs are worth those figures and so it would seem that the New Zealand prices should be closer to one third of the Australian prices instead of three times as much!!! Will prices continue to fall? We will have to wait and see.

An interesting sideline is the recent launch by Strategic Media into the international market with the "International" version of the Science and Technology pack. The timing for this was probably unfortunate in hindsight but should allow all interested in these products to obtain them fairly cheaply now which is probably a blessing in disguise as it will mean that the real collector will have a chance to keep up with his or her collection of packs.

The prognosis for past NZ packs is glum but will allow the collector to build up their collection without undue market pressures from an overheating market situation.

Tip 1. Do not invest in the early New Zealand Packs this month.

Australian cards are being sought eagerly (not in a frenzy) in Australia and the increase in sales are related to the initial interest shown by New Zealand collectors and now Australian collectors who have caught on to what has happened and are now trying to obtain those earlier scarce packs and individual cards. Judging from the larger dealer price lists and from phone conversations with them, it appears the prices for the earlier packs, etc. are now stabilising somewhat. Four weeks ago if a price remained

constant for two days it was a miracle! Now, firm figures appear to be levelling out in all the confusion partly due to the fact that collectors have reached the point where they are happy to supply dealers at current levels. With this stock being supplied to dealers the prices are now stabilising.

The collector base continues to expand at a steady rate and much interest is being shown in whether Telecom will offcially release the number of packs that were actually issued, ie., taking into account the number of those "destroyed" by Telecom. The longer it takes them to release this information the harder it will be for those in Telecom to prevent some in "the know" (or perceived "know") from profiteering from the information. Already much speculation has gone on with certain packs in the market place. The most obvious "surprise" examples of packs escalating all of a sudden would be the \$5 Generic, the Red Cross and the Endangered Species '93 packs. I managed to buy a Red Cross pack for \$220 last month and then was able to sell it to an interstate dealer for \$280!! Telecom should release this information as soon as possible so as to ensure that this speculation is kept to a minimum.

Custom cards continue to be produced and the frequency is starting to pick up. Telecom have completed the \$4 Social Security cards and are now turning their attention to printing Custom cards. I was noting the English situation where they have produced around 300 Custom cards, mostly with print runs of 500-1,000, in the last three years. They sell for around A\$20 each and so represent about A\$2,000 per year to keep up with. Rick Warnecke's article in the July issue estimates a figure of \$2,000 for Australia for 100 cards per year. This would appear to represent the expected number of issues and the cost of buying them.

Some new players are coming into the production side of Custom cards in Australia. Collectors are buying the Custom cards issued so far, dealers are obviously selling them and the manufacturers are benefitting. With the increased volume being produced however, both the collector <u>and</u> the dealer will become more discerning in relation to what they collect and stock for no other reason than purely economic.

#### Is the issue of \$50 cards with a print run of less than 10,000 a "bad thing"?

Why single out \$50 Custom cards and not \$2 ones? Because anyone can produce a \$2 card and so the market will eventually (by supply and demand) decide which and at what price, these cards will occur. The \$50 cards require a much bigger outlay but will return a far greater dividend to those very few individuals or groups able to put up the necessary finance to get them off the ground. This will allow these people to control the frequency of issue and also the resulting price movements and so the New Zealand situation with those packs of 500 etc. could occur here within 12-24 months.

Strategic Media are the next (after the Roam Pacific Apollo card) to produce a \$50 card. They are actually producing four at the same time and from the theme (animal eyes), they should sell really well. Telecom Australia have decided that official issue \$50 cards do not sell well in the market place and may not produce another as they have finished with Generic series type cards.

#### What will happen with these short run \$50 cards?

Many cards in Australia sell for large sums. Examples being the 3rd print Swimming and the 4th print \$5 Generic. These are expensive because they were neglected at the time. The manufactured scarce \$50 cards will not be neglected; rather they will be salted away and believe me, some dealers/speculators/investers will have enough to supply the ever growing price spiral over the next twelve months. If a majority of a scarce card is in the possesion of a selected few then the product is destined for a rapid rise in price (not based on real demand but brought about by a monopolistic situation). The reason that the price goes up is that few people have them but the price goes up too quickly because the supply is not actually restricted (for those few who have them!). A total of 3,000, \$50 Apollo cards exist - I would suggest that around 100-200, maximum, of the 4th print \$5 Generic ever emerged onto the market and so if a \$50 card sells for \$1,000, the Generic should sell for \$10,000!!

These developments are the worst thing that Telecom could allow to happen. By permitting groups and individuals to produce cards for the collector market and not allowing ordinary collectors like you and I to obtain cards at a nominal price above face, they are inadvertently setting up the Australian phonecard scene to follow the New Zealand history.

#### Open Letter to Telecom

Please allow all cards produced with a Telecom Logo, to be sold to the general public at a small premium over face. This will prevent unhealthy speculation taking place and will ensure that normal growth of collector numbers continues into the future.

## "THE WORLD OF ELVIS"

Further to an article in the May issue of "The Australasian Phonecard Monthly", which featured the Australian launch of AmeriVox's "The World Of Elvis" phonecard collection, this follow up article is produced with the permission of its authors, David Eastis and Dr. Gary S. Felton.

With AmeriVox's The World of Elvis the phonecard arena and the record world have received a wonderful, hybrid offering which involves each of these substantial manufacturing and hobby realms. It is the first melding of the two products and opens the door for several million collectors of either or both of them as well as for the millions of Elvis fans around the globe.

In recent issues of several phonecard magazines and journals The World of Elvis has been introduced and written about in considerable detail. This detailing has dealt with the evolutionary and developmental aspects of the project which resulted in The World of Elvis as well as with some of the specifics about this giant product containing phonecards and a picture disc. You might refer to such materials if you are interested in background information of this nature.

For the writing here, we will take a comprehensive and fully detailed look at all facets of the actual <u>end product</u>. This focus will involve all of the phonecards and the picture disc which comprise the complete special album.

#### State of the Art

This special product, The World of Elvis, officially was released in the form of option 1 - 20 phonecards and a descriptive booklet insert, on the 6th of January, 1994, in its national media campaign launch from Elvis's Graceland residence. The second format, option 2, was released officially on the 1st of April, 1994, and contained the same 20 cards as option 1 as well as a 21st, montage card (composed of 8 views extracted from 5 of the 20 cards), a 22nd, .9999 fine gold phonecard, a double sided multi-colour, mylar picture disc of Elvis in an interview from 1960 in West Germany, its accompanying illustrated protector sleeve, as well as the booklet insert which reviews all aspects of the entire project and product. The disc includes 28 original photographs of or about Elvis through various stages of his life. All of the photographs were hand selected by Elvis Presley Enterprises Inc., for inclusion in this work.

The first 3,777 copies of the album jacket are front side printed as "PROMO COPY" and the copies

thereafter feature a different artistic front side logo stating "Limited Edition". These two features are shown below.





The first 25,777 buyers of **The World of Elvis** receive an extra, 23rd, \$7.77 card showing Elvis and his chimpanzee looking at a movie script.

Available to all buyers of this product is the opportunity to join the Elvis Phonecard Collectors Club and with such membership, receive the right to buy the gold card and the picture disc (the only way that these latter items are obtainable). This membership brings with it an inactive phonecard for the member's signature on the back.

#### Presentation of cards

The first 20 cards are displayable on the inside two pages of the gatefold album jacket in such a manner as to form the initials "E P" as shown in the accompanying diagram which depicts the proper order for the cards' placement.

#### SET 1

#### Card 1 - Childhood

\$2

Elvis Aaron Presley at age two with his parents. Gladys Love Smith Presley (25 April 1912-14 August 1958) and Vernon Elvis Presley (10 April 1916-26 June 1979) in Tupelo, Mississippi, 1937. Elvis attended East Tupelo Consolidated School.

#### Card 2 - Family

\$7

This magnificent family portrait was taken in the living room at Graceland in June, 1958.

#### Card 3 - Military

\$11

Proudly wearing his U.S. Army uniform at a press conference in Fort Dix, New Jersey in 1969, Elvis had just returned from West Germany after two years of service and was about to re-enter civilian life. He could have spent his army years entertaining but chose to serve "just like everyone else". Colonel Tom Parker rented a private train to take him home to Memphis and they stopped for thousands of fans at locations along the way.

#### Card 4 - The Eyes of Elvis \$14

The eyes are the window of the soul. Almost everyone who sees these eyes instantly recognises them as the eyes of the most photographed person in history - Elvis Presley. This close up of a 1956 photo of Elvis reveals his irresistible charm and youthful anticipation for the future. These eyes could not have seen the magnitude of the fame, fortune and heartache that were to be his in the coming years. This captivating phonecard adorned the front cover of the November 1993 issue of Premier Telecard Magazine.

#### **SET II**

#### Card 5 - Meditation

Elvis was an extremely introspective, deeply spiritual person and this 1956 photo with design elements by Krista Ann Ninami captures his thoughtful nature.

#### Card 6 - Enchantment \$

This 1956 close up makes the viewer wonder what Elvis was dreaming about. What visions did he have at the young age of 21? The piercing picture provides a sense of the magnetism, charm and enchantment that were Elvis then and are still now.

#### Card 7 - Four Elvises \$11

Elvis Presley wearing his world famous gold lame suit. The photograph was taken by Bob Fraker in 1957. This magnetic design by Krista Ann Minami was one of the two Elvis phonecards pictured on the front cover of the December, 1993 edition of International Telephone Cards magazine.

#### Card 8 - Eternal Elvis \$14

Artwork borrowed from Michelangelo Buonarotti's the "Creation of Man" is on the left of the card and a photograph of Elvis taken in 1960 is on the right. Talented artist Krista Ann Minami created this masterpiece which powerfully symbolises the eternality of Elvis. As he held a favourite statue of

Alexander of Macedon, Elvis used to kid others that he looked Roman or Greek.

 Card 9 - Solo

These four cards are done in a Warholesque fashion by artist Krista Ann Minami. The images speak to a new generation of young people who were not around when Elvis was alive, yet who are enthralled by the music and life of Elvis Presley. It is the mixture of contemporary design and nostalgic black and white photographs that so vividly illustrates the large spectrum of variety which makes this entire phonecard collection unique. The photograph of Elvis was taken while on tour in 1957. The musical notes are taken from the gates at Graceland.

#### **SET IV**

#### Card 13 - Phone

\$2

There are many fascinating photographs of Elvis talking on the phone, including this one from "The Louisiana Hayride", 1955.

#### Card 14 - Baseball \$7

Elvis enjoyed many sports including football, waterskiing, baseball and karate. This 1959 photo shows Elvis playing baseball in his back yard while stationed with the U.S. Army in West Germany.

#### Card 15 - Piano \$

The piano was Elvis's favourite musical instrument after the guitar. He was taught to play the piano at the Ellis Civic Auditorium in Memphis, Tennessee. This portrait of him playing the piano is a classic. As with Cards 4 and 6, the blue in Elvis's eyes has been deepened slightly, thereby causing some people to realise that Elvis did in fact have blue eyes! The rest of the photograph remains in its original form. You can almost imagine Elvis singing a gospel song as he plays the piano here.

#### Card 16 - Glow in the Dark \$14

In 1956 Elvis and his manager decided to start a line of collectables which his fans could purchase. There were such items as Tedy Bear Perfume, Elvis pens and posters. This image is a 1957 glow-in-the-dark picture which measures 8" x 10". Thirty seven years later, the original still does glow in the dark! To illustrate Elvis's popularity, in the first year of releasing Elvis collectables, 1957, he sold more than \$20 million worth of memorabilia!

#### SET V

#### Card 17 - Comeback Concert \$2

After starring in 24 movies from 1960-1968, Elvis recorded the '68 Comeback Television Special in Hollywood in June, 1968; the special was aired on 3 December, 1968. The magic of this electrifying performance was that Elvis was back with his adoring public, singing the songs that made him irrefutably the 'King of Rock and Roll'.

#### Card 18 - World's Greatest Performer \$

Photo of the uncontested 'King of Rock and Roll' taken in February, 1970, at the international Hotel (later renamed the Las Vegas Hilton). Elvis was awarded a spectacular gold/silver/diamond-studded belt (shown on the picture disc) for breaking all Las Vegas attendance records.

#### Card 19 - Las Vegas Days \$11

Also taken at a packed concert in February, 1970, at the International Hotel in Las Vegas, this photo shows the King receiving wild applause between songs. Barron Hilton placed a plaque in honour of Elvis at the Las Vegas Hilton which says - "Memories of Elvis will always be with us....The Las Vegas Hilton was Elvis's home away from home. His attendance records are a legend. We will miss him. Thanks, Elvis, from all of us".

#### Card 20 - Heavanly Elvis \$14

Elvis commissioned this spectacular painting by Ralph Wolfe Cowan in 1969 and it now hangs in Elvis's trophy building at Graceland. It was Elvis's favourite painting of himself and it stands about six feet high and three feet wide. After Cowan completed the painting, Elvis paid him \$10,000. Since Elvis liked the artwork so much, he paid Cowan an additional \$8,000 to own full rights to it. AmeriVox is gratefull to Graceland for allowing us to use this special painting in The World Of Elvis. Gil Michael photographed the painting.

#### **Extra Added Attractions**

#### <u>Card</u> 21 - <u>Elvis Phonecard Club Membership</u> <u>Montage Card</u> \$11

AmeriVox selected eight separate images from five of the Elvis phonecards to feature on the Montage card which is available only to Elvis Phonecard Club Members.

#### Card 22 - Gold Phonecard

Contains 1 gram of .9999 fine gold and it is the first solid gold phonecard on which Elvis's image has appeared. This amazing collectable may be purchased only by Elvis Phonecard Club Members. It is fitting for the King that this striking photograph of Elvis in the gold lame suit is printed on solid gold using an exclusive precious metal process by Mitsubishi in Japan. The photograph of Elvis was taken by Bob Fraker in 1957.

#### Card 23 - \$7.77 \$7.77

This card is available only as a free phonecard for the first 25,777 customers who purchase The World of Elvis phonecard series. Scatter was Elvis's chimpanzee and this photo was taken of Elvis looking at a script with his pet on a movie set in 1962. Scatter lived with Elvis at Graceland and at his home in Bel Air, California.

Card 24 - Phonecard Club Membership Card \$0
There is no calling time on this card. It is presented to collectors and fans who purchase the optional Elvis Phonecard Club membership. There is space on the reverse side for the member's signature.

#### The World of Elvis Picture Disc

This record is a two sided, 12" mylar product and features an Armed Forces Network Radio Interview with Elvis in Frankfurt, West Germany, in 1960 (see page 30). There have been many mylar picture discs produced over the years which feature the King of Rock and Roll. To our knowledge, however, there has never been a collage of rare Elvis photographs used on a two sided, full colour picture disc before this one. Many of these photographes were taken at Graceland by Gil Michael Photography of Memphis, Tennessee, especially for this project; Elvis's High School the gold phone he used, Diploma, gold/silver/diamond belt awarded to Elvis for breaking all attendance records in Las Vegas and one of Elvis's many guitars.

Some of these photographs appear on The World of Elvis phonecards and each one was personally approved by Elvis Presley Enterprises Inc. There are also a few pictures of the wall in front of Graceland where thousands of Elvis's loyal fans have written him messages of adoration through the years since his untimely death in 1977. The "TCB" logo signifies Elvis's personally selected motto, "Taking Care of Business". He had the logo painted on his two jets as well as on other items. There also appears the marble cross at the Presley gravesite, originally an area Elvis created as the meditation Garden. "Elvis I Love You" is inscribed on the Graceland wall by one of Elvis's loyal fans.

The manufacture of this special disc was carefully directed by Liz Dunster, President of ERIKA Records, using the most sophisticated 5-step, highest quality "sandwich" production process.

#### Summary

With the release of The World of Elvis a new channel has been carved out for a large group of phonecard and record collectors around the world and for many fans of Elvis Presley everywhere. It promises to bring a brand new slant to the collecting world with regard to hybridizing of hobbies. For the next brief period of time we will track its success with eagerness and enthusiasm and will begin to anticipate other forms of working with these two hobbies as well as others.

## FOCUS ON FARAWAY PLACES

#### This Month: DIEGO GARCIA

#### by Cyril Fox

Diego Garcia is an island in the Indian Ocean, lying North East of Mauritius and roughly midway between the Seychelles and the Cocos-Keeling Islands. It is the site of a strategic British naval base (not to be confused with the former French naval base of Diego Suarez at the northern end of Madagascar).

Magnetic phonecards by Autelca have been in use on the island since 1985. The telephone service is run by Cable & Wireless. In nine years there have been only two issues of phonecards:-

#### First Issue (1985 to 1993)

Cards of four values were issued:

17 units, blue and grey (illustrated) 50 units, blue and green 100 units, blue and pale blue 200 units, blue and red.

This issue displays the old Cable & Wireless logo. Only the 17 unit card is easily found.



#### Second Issue (since 1993)

In 1993 the cards were re-issued bearing the new Cable & Wireless logo and with modifications to the colour and design of the cards. The 50 unit card is illustrated here. As yet, the new logo cards are not easily found.



#### Identification

Diego Garcia phonecards are identified by the prefix letter "D" in the control number. These cards look just like the old Falkland Island cards, except that the Falkland cards have the prefix letter "F" in the control number.

## DEALING WITH DEALERS

#### by Robert Ulseth

Many phonecards are available at phonecard club meetings and from other collectors, however, it is impossible to complete a telephone card collection without purchasing at least some cards from a phonecard dealer.

Dealing with dealers is something that has to be learnt and practiced and only improves with time and experience. A few guide lines may avoid a disturbing experience that can put a collector off dealers forever to the detriment of both parties.

The first thing to keep in mind is that dealers are experienced therefore, you must be well prepared before going out to do business. Before selling telephone cards to a dealer, check with the most recent price lists. Dealers, depending on stocks, usually pay about 60% of selling prices. If you do not want to accept that price, leave your cards at home.

Do NOT work from memory alone when purchasing telephone cards. Make your own notes whenever you see something of interest in a magazine. Be exact in your notes and do not abreviate them too much as there is nothing worse than not being able to understand your own notes easily. I have found that a folder with "A4 Copy Safe" inserts is very useful. This allows photocopies of relevant information to be stored easily and be readily seen. Two or three empty phonecard storage pages at the back allow somewhere to put any cards that you purchase.

Learn a little about the dealers by responding to adverts and meeting them at fairs whenever possible. Larger dealers are now emerging, for example "Edlins of Canberra" have huge postal auctions, whilst Cyril Fox of Victoria is well versed in first issues and puts out an excellent world price list, a must for the world card collector.

As collectors, our best opportunity for bargains in world cards is in our ability to know our chosen theme or subject better than the dealer who has so many cards to sell he does not have time (or know) to check if the 1990 Bulgarian East German manufactured 10 lev yellow phonecard has an "s" in the top left or not and that it is really worth \$220 not the \$6 price he has put on it!

Make it your business to be able to interpret as much information from a phonecard as possible, as there is certainly a lot of enjoyment to be had.

Overseas collectors who take the time to understand prefix numbers of Australian cards have a wonderfull opportunity to turn the phonecard over and look for low print run cards as I know they they are out there as I sent a few away in the 'early days' before prefix collecting became fully established.

In conclusion, preparing to set forth on a buying trip can add another dimension to the most fascinating hobby of phonecard collecting and minimising the risk of returning home with cards that once you look at properly, realize are not what you were after.
