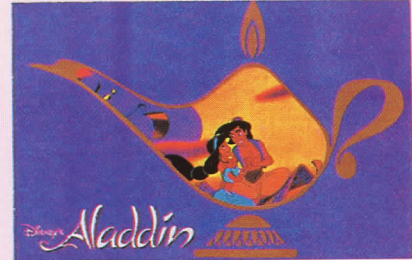

## **EDITORIAL**

### **AusCard '96**

As I write this Editorial, AusCard '96 is but three weeks away. Something that I started planning and organising in October last year is 'suddenly' upon me. Readers will note an extended section focussing on AusCard '96 between the pages 17 -32.

### **Price Guide**

For a considerable period of time, many readers have indicated that they would "like to see" the inclusion of a **regular** Price Guide in APM, for all the Phonecards printed by Telstra.

Their requests are based on a number of needs; to 'see' what their cards/collections 'are worth'; to be able to plot market moves to try and pick good and bad buys or sales, and, simply to have a guide for 'fair' prices.

With the publication of this issue, I have commenced, at pages 39-41, - and to be published on a **bi-monthly** basis - the inclusion of a Price Guide in the magazine.

This Guide has been compiled with direct input from prominent dealers located in Sydney, Melbourne and Canberra. It is **not** their buying or selling guide **nor** is it an average of current, dealer price lists.

Based on information supplied, it is an attempt to provide readers with a **considered** and **objective** price listing for all Telstra cards produced.

It is proposed that on alternate months to the above listing, a further Price Guide for phonecards of the other telecommunications companies operating in this country (PayTel, Card Phone, Unicom, One.Tel, Ezy-Call, etc.) as well as companies such as Visa International, will be produced.

With the continued growth in the number of call-time suppliers, such a listing will provide readers with a clear indication of **all** the phonecards being produced in this country.

Believe me, there are many phonecards being produced for sale and use in this country which the majority of collectors know little or nothing about!!

### **Promotion**

This last comment takes me back to last month's Editorial in which I asked for reader input as to how to publicise the hobby of phonecard collecting - in fact - to publicise the very existence of phonecards in this country.

The response has been excellent and the "Letter of the Month" together with excerpts from others have been included at page 34 in this issue.

Whilst a number of ideas and recommendations have been put forward, the main theme emerging from the correspondence received has focussed on the need for positive promotion and advertising .

Recommendations have varied in regards to who's **responsibility** such functions are - from it being the role of 'big budget' Telstra right down through (not so big budget) dealers, to the individual collector.

Obviously, all have a role to play - Telstra, other telcos, dealers, clubs, collectors, card producers, this magazine, etc.

I agree with the need for promotion and advertising. I **also feel that this has to be effective.**

I really do think that there are a number of 'closet collectors' that do not know of the many **support avenues** which exist which could be of assistance to them, eg. publications such as Telstra's "Bulletin", PayTel's "Collector", the APM, etc., the many Phonecard Clubs, dealers, etc. etc.

I have attended many fairs lately and the comment of many (new) attendees as they flick through a copy of APM is, "I didn't know (such) existed!!!"

# AUSTRALIAN NEWS UPDATE

## TELSTRA

### PhoneAway

Telstra is introducing a **new** prepaid calling card - **PhoneAway**. PhoneAway can be used to make local, STD and 0011 International calls, from virtually any telephone in Australia and to call Australia from 34 overseas countries.

PhoneAway is a great idea for the budget concious traveller and is also an ideal gift for a loved one on the other side of the country or a relative 'back home'.

I think this is an **excellent development** on Telstra's part as, speaking from experience, such a card will be 'very handy'. I had previously used Telstra's Phone Australia phonecard when in Jakarta last year. I was able to obtain **22 minutes** of call time with a **\$50** card, using both a public payphone as well as the phone in my hotel room, as opposed to 11 minutes call time using an Indonesian phonecard of an eqivelant value.

International travellers returning with un-used call time on the Phone Australia card, had to wait for further international travel to be able to use up such time. Now, any surplus time can be used nationally.

I can also see myself using the PhoneAway card from hotel/motel room phones. Calls will be debited from the card at Telstra's payphone rates as opposed to hotel/motel rates - **a big difference!**

To use the phonecard in Australia, you simply dial an **access number** (1819), which is packaged with the card, then dial the **identification number** on the reverse of the card and then the **phone number** required. A recorded voice announcement takes the caller through the process.

PhoneAway cards are available in denominations of **\$10, \$20, \$50 and \$100**, with the first release featuring striking **Australian landscape scenes**.



PhoneAway is **available** from Telstra Phonecard Collector Service, or can be purchased from Telstra Shops, newsagencies, domestic and international airports and travel outlets. The PhoneAway cards will not be part of the Standing Order.

**PhoneAway will replace Phone Australia.** The Phone Australia cards sold to date can still be used as intended.



### Royal Easter Show Phonecard

Telstra Payphone Services will be attending the Royal Easter Show held from 29 March to 9 April 1996, in Sydney.

To celebrate this year's Show, Telstra will produce **6,000 Telstra Phonecards** featuring the 1996 Royal Easter Show's **mascots** - the rooster, cow and pig. This card will carry the **Promotional** card code.

4,000 cards will be available for sale at the Telstra Payphone Services' stand at the Show. Collectors with a Standing Order Arrangement for Advertising cards will also receive the card with any remaining cards not sold at the Show being issued through the *Australian Phonecard Bulletin*.

There will be a limit of **five** cards per collector. The Telstra Payphone Services' stand can be found in the **Living Centre** near the RAS Administration Building. Telstra staff look forward to seeing you there.

### Increased Phonecard Commissions for Newsagents Assoc. Members

Newsagents who sell Telstra's Phonecards currently earn **3%** off invoice, ie., they 'make' 3 cents in the dollar per sale.

As from 1 May '96, the commission has increased as follows:-

\$ 5 Phonecards	4% commission
\$10 Phonecards	4% commission
\$20 Phonecards	5% commission
\$50 Phonecards	5% commission

plus, if accounts are paid via direct debit activation the newsagent earns an extra 1% off invoice.

A total of 3 cents in the dollar - going up to (a possible) 6 cents from May - does not sound like 'a lot' but when one notes that the "newsagency network accounts for over **40% of the \$100 million per annum Phonecard sales**", it 'adds up'.

Under the above proposal, Telstra will no longer be 'channelling' their cards to re-sellers via distributors but will "deliver direct to each outlet".

### EZI Phonecall Card

On entering my 'local' newsagency (one of many in Tamworth) I was interested to note a selection of **EZI Phonecall Cards** on display and for sale.

These included the following denominations and images:-

\$10	Koala
\$10	Possum
\$20	Lorikeet

If readers refer back to **page 13 of the December '95 issue of APM**, they will note a reproduction of two of the early EZI Phonecall Cards, one of which is the \$10 Koala card mentioned above.

These Phonecards are prepaid remote access cards for use nationally (within Australia).

Using any payphone or phone, a 1800 number is entered, followed by an authorisation number (contained on the card), followed by the number you want to reach.

## Cash Back Cards

A new cash rebate scheme type card will be a world first when launched in Sydney's eastern suburbs, north shore, inner west and south to Sutherland, in early May 1996.

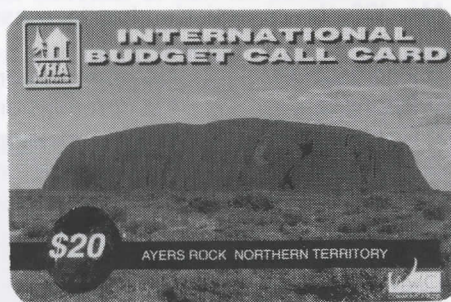
It is believed that both Optus and Telstra are examining the scheme which will eventually become a fully fledged smart card.

Basically, "Cash Back will offer consumers discounts of up to 10 percent which will be deposited in a nominated bank account each month". This 'money in the bank' will be able to be spent by the consumer in any way desired.

The scheme will be launched in Sydney by former Test cricket captain, Ian Chappell. It is aiming for two million members after 12 months.

## Remote Access Phonecards

Featured below are two more remote access phonecards issued for use in Australia. It appears that the 'Ayers Rock' card may be issued by the Youth Hostel Assoc. of Australia whilst the 'Grey Kangaroo' card appears to be issued by/through the International VIP Backpackers Resorts.



Call instructions (on the rear of each card) are similar - a 1800 number is dialed, then the PIN inserted and then the phone number. If an international call is to be made, the usual country codes, etc. precede the phone number.

The YHA card has instruction in German on the reverse as well as in English, whilst the 'Backpackers' card has a detailed note on the habitat, etc. of the Grey Kangaroo.

The phonecards are a 'light cardboard' and appear to have been 'ripped' from a pad - the top of each is serrated. Cheap, attractive and effective as a phonecard!

I will try to find out some more about these cards. Do any readers know of them?

# UNICOM

## PHONECARDS Pty Ltd

The September '95 issue of APM included an article on the all Australian owned company Unicom PhoneCards Pty. Ltd.; a company which provides a telecommunication product, the Unicom Phonecard. The following is an update on this company.

### The Company

After several years of researching the telecommunications market world wide, Unicom Phonecards was formed by two international businessmen, Zain M. Sheriff and Iqbal H. Fakhri. The management of Unicom is vested in Mr Sheriff and Mr Fakhri, both of whom are citizens and residents of Australia.

The head office is located at Castle Hill, NSW, whilst there are Country Directors appointed in Pakistan, Indonesia, United States, New Zealand, Hong Kong, Canada, Singapore, Malaysia and Korea.

### The PhoneCard

The Unicom PhoneCard is a telephone debit card. It operates from any touch phone out of 36 countries where the Unicom service is currently available.

Each Unicom PhoneCard is numbered and is allocated its own Personal Identification Number (PIN) when activated the first time. The PIN remains with the card for its lifetime, regardless of how many times it is re-activated.

Using the card is simple. The caller dials a toll-free number and a voice prompt requests the PIN. When entered, the prompt advises the dollar value left on the card. The prompt asks for the destination number to be dialled, then advises the talk time available based on the dollars left on the card and the number dialled. The call is then connected.

Unicom PhoneCard utilises the services of a telephone switch located in Denver, Colorado, on a shared basis. It is manned by customer service personnel 24 hours a day in 6 languages - English, Italian, French, Arabic, German and Spanish.

The Unicom PhoneCard is **targeted** to international and long distance travellers who normally use hotel phones or other non personal phones.

The flat rate price per minute and the reduced international rate schedule means a substantial saving over hotels and payphones both in the US and internationally.

The card is **rechargeable**. It can be activated and reactivated with a minimum of US\$30 (no upper limit) with any international credit card.

### Limited Edition Folder

From 6-9 December 1995, in Kuala Lumpur, the Malaysian International Telecommunications Business & Electronics Communications Systems

and Information Technology Exhibition & Conference took place.

Unicom PhoneCards attended this first ever comprehensive exhibition for the telecommunication industry in Malaysia.

The company created and released a **Limited Edition folder**, as a Collector's item, marking the occasion of **Telecom Malaysia '95**. 1000 sets of two cards - \$US30 (gold) and US\$15 (silver) - were packaged and sold at the exhibition.

# INDONESIA

## Latest Releases

During my visit to Jakarta late last year, I had the pleasure to meet Jusuf Kadir, keen collector of phonecards and the author of three issues (to date) of "The Collectors Guide to Indonesia Telephone Cards".

Jusuf had agreed to provide me with an update on new issues of that country's cards and the following is the first of such articles.

### Sister Cities - Jakarta & NSW

125 Units - 50,000 printed

This phonecard will undoubtedly interest many, particularly those collectors who collect 'Australiana' on the cards of foreign countries.

The top of the card depicts Keong Mas (Golden Snail), which is situated in Taman Mini Indonesia Indah. The structure is shaped like a giant golden snail and under its snail form roof is a round hall which contains a spectacular cinematic journey through Indonesia on an Omnimax screen. Viewers feel as if they are part of the film being screened.



The lower part of the card contains a view of the Sydney Opera House.

### Soa-Soa Ambon

75 Units - 400,000 printed

This Ambonese Sail-Fin Lizard (*Hydrosaurus amboinensis*) is a relative of the species by the same name from Australia. This species of lizard originates in the Maluku but is also found in Sulawesi, Irian Jaya and the Philippines.



It usually lives near water, often basking in the sun on a tree branch that hangs over water. The enlarged scales on its toes enable the Sail-Fin to run across the surface of water when danger threatens.

### Gajah Sumatra

125 Units - 200,000 printed

The Sumatran Elephant (*Elephas maximus sumatrensis*) is restricted to the island of Sumatra, frequently angering villagers by trampling crops in search of food due to its shrinking habitats.



Sumatran elephants are smaller than their African counterpart, their foreheads have two humps instead of a smooth curve, their backs are arched rather than swayed and they have four or five toes on their hind feet, whereas the African have three.

This huge herbivore actually almost killed me after I took this photo. Perhaps he was frightened of my camera flash which made him run after me!

### Lingsang Air

75 Units - 400,000 printed

The fish eating Oriental Short-Clawed Otter (*Amblonyx cinerea*), is a small and graceful swimmer. The skinny Lingsang has sharp, pointed teeth like a cat's.



It is the only true amphibious member of the weasel family. They forage in water but are equally at home on land. The tightly packed underfur and long hair guards of the otter are water repellent, whilst the body is elongated, sinuous and lithe, built for vigorous swimming.

The Oriental Short-Clawed Otter is the smallest of all otters, with forefeet that are only partially webbed.

The diet of the otter is varied, but most species eat frogs, crayfish, crabs and fish - usually sluggish non game species such as roach, sticklebacks or eels.



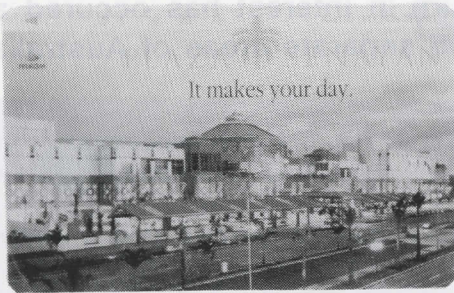
Like most carnivores, they consume their catch immediately.

Plaza Senayan is the newest and biggest Shopping Mall in Jakarta, having opened early last year.

This phonecard is special in that only 5000 were printed. These were distributed privately by the Mall and are very difficult to obtain.

# THE GRAPEVINE

by Insider

A recent surge in collector demand has been noted at various fair venues all over Australia. It is all the more surprising that this upturn in interest has occurred at around the same point in time, in widely different and separate areas of Australia, from Western Australia to Queensland to Victoria.

The boom of 1994 was in part caused by the speculative advertising in this and other magazines at the time, and the recent upturn is more remarkable because **none** of this speculative advertising has taken place over the last few months.

If anything, the message emerging from the magazine from low advertised prices was that of a **buyers market** which is not the beginnings of a speculative onslaught of the market!

However, those advertising the lowest prices have not always had the stock that they advertised, resulting in the advertisers scurrying around trying to find the stock to sell to those answering their adverts. As this was occurring, others, (including those who actually had the stock) were realising that demand was overtaking supply on several items and since the advertised selling price was so low, those aware enough of the situation started to look around to buy that material at the best price available.

Recent dealer activity has centred on particular scarce cards from early sets where the advertised selling price was way below "real" market levels. Looking at the new price guide in this magazine, it can easily be seen which cards show the largest difference in price from recent advertised price and guide list prices - these are the cards most likely being sourced by the dealers.

One example is the **\$10 Generic Original** which is as scarce as a 'hen's tooth'; list price \$140 against recently advertised price of around \$80, whilst another example is the **\$10 Red Cross** which is just as scarce; list price of \$80 against an advertised price of around \$25!

Excellent turnouts to fairs have occurred in WA (February Exhibition), QLD (Shopping Mall Fair), Vic. (Caulfield Fair), as well as the usual good turn-out for the Opera House and International Fairs in Sydney. In each case the key feature was advertising to areas other than the existing collector base, through such means as the magazine and mailing lists. Fair organisers also used the **local media** to make local residents aware of the respective fair details.

Due to the depressed situation in the industry, fair organisers may have been reluctant to expend money on advertising which resulted in a cycle of reduced collector turnout, which in turn produced reduced dealer turnout, which in turn placed pressure on the fair organiser to **again** reduce the advertising budget!

This was the story of 1995 but with the evidence generated from the smaller new fairs, such as above, it must now be obvious that the **way ahead** is with innovative methods of advertising and if this is not done, dealers will 'vote with their feet' and switch allegiance to those new fairs being run by 'young-uns' (*Dan O'Loughlin young?!! - Ed.*) with entrepreneurial skills and a policy of minimising expenses for dealers attending these fairs instead of running the fairs as a money making venture.

The only conclusion possible from the success of the above fairs is that **there are a large number of 'closet' collectors out there** and if the fair is placed close enough to the collectors and advertised widely enough, then attendances are guaranteed!

**Strong interest** is being shown in **early Australian used/mint** as well as **Custom** cards (especially used) which are more available now due to the 'dumping' that took place last year. Thematic interest is growing and evidence is noticed of a growing number of collectors specialising in countries **other** than Australia. The presence of **P.N.G. Telikom** at **AusCard '96** should boost the number of collectors of this country's beautiful phonecards, especially since they sorted out their distribution channels last year enabling dealers to receive their orders fairly soon after cards were issued.

The advertising and promotion of AusCard '96 is well advanced and as such should see a good turnout of collectors. See you there!

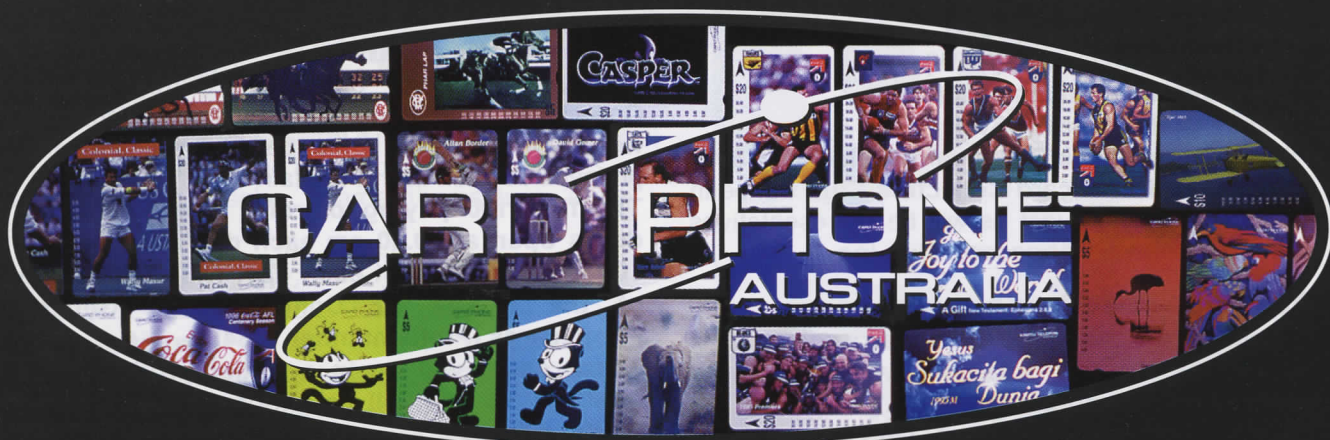

# Telecom New Zealand's SPOT Comes Home

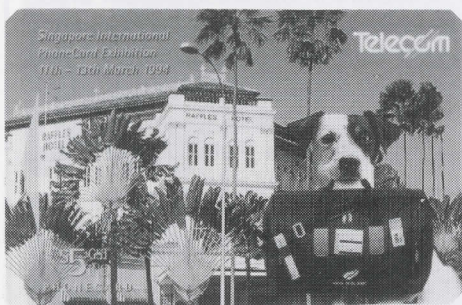
The tough, tenacious little black and white Jack Russell Terrier that has become Telecom New Zealand's mascot returns home for AusCard '96 on a specially produced PhoneCard.

SPOT, as the lovable Jack Russell is known, was born in Australia but found true fame and fortune fronting Telecom New Zealand's highly successful products and services advertising campaign.

The SPOT concept was conceived back in 1991 by Telecom's advertising agency Saachi & Saachi Wellington. With the brief being "to develop a multimedia campaign that would set Telecom apart from its competitors as a quality provider of a wide range of innovative products and services", Saachi & Saachi recommended the use of a visual device to symbolise the services Telecom offers and how they work. That device was SPOT, the name being derived from **S**ervices and **P**roducts of **T**elecom.

Now seven years old, SPOT is a veteran of over **30 television commercials**, for which **21 New Zealand and international advertising awards** have been won. SPOT has since gone far beyond being just an advertising device - he is now completely synonymous with Telecom. A star in his own right, SPOT is identified on the streets by young and old, and receives regular fan mail.

SPOT's lovable character meant it was natural that his work extend in promoting Telecom's services, in this case, to **Phonecards**, in local and international markets. His debut in this arena came in 1993 when he appeared in the 'SPOT the Dog' set of four cards and collector pack. SPOT was captured taking in a few of New Zealand's top tourist locations, with the series proving very popular, largely due to the public's general love of SPOT.

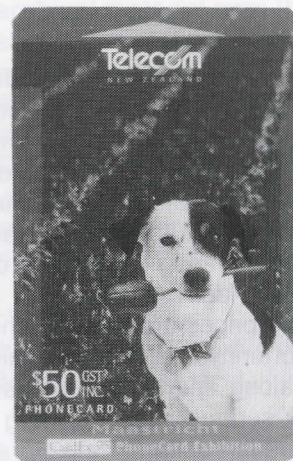


He has since appeared on a further dozen PhoneCards. His first foray off-shore was in **1994 to the Singapore phonecard fair and CardEx '94**. Single cards depicting SPOT on location were produced for both fairs and packaged into the specially developed, unique 'Passpot' folder.

The original 'Passpot' concept has been further developed to cater for his visits to **last year's Singapore Phonecard Exhibition**, **Philatelia mit T-card International Fair in Cologne** and the **Maastricht Phonecard Exhibition**.

Interest in the six PhoneCards, two for each fair, was considerable. As only 2000 'Passpot' folders containing all six cards were produced, distribution was by means of a ballot which was over subscribed by several hundreds of collectors. The \$20 and \$50 denomination cards were not available through any other means, whilst singles of the \$5 cards were snapped up at their respective fairs.

To celebrate the attendance of the **New Zealand Telecom Phonecard Collector Service at AusCard '96**, a special PhoneCard has been produced depicting SPOT on location, with the **Sydney Harbour Bridge and Opera House** in the background. Only 3000 of this \$5 card will be produced, with 1000 available for sale at the exhibition and the remaining 2000 held for insertion into **Passpot '96**, which will be produced later this year.

# PAPUA NEW GUINEA COMES TO SYDNEY TOWN

Papua New Guinea Telikom is making its first appearance at an International Phonecard Fair when it officially participates at AusCard '96 in Sydney, 19-21 April.

In 1994, P.N.G. produced a special phonecard for the International Phonecard Exhibition in Essen, Germany, but did not attend the show, although some of its cards were available through dealer outlets. The Essen Exhibition card had a print run of 5,000 and is now extremely elusive, having sold out over a year ago, mainly through local sales, which continue to absorb the vast majority of all P.N.G. phonecards.

To **commemorate** its attendance at AusCard '96, P.N.G. Telikom is producing a special card in the form of the recently issued K20 Bird of Paradise (*Paradisea guilielmi*), **overprinted AusCard '96**, with the additional inscription on the reverse; "International Phonecard Exhibition and Fair, Sydney Opera House, 19 - 21 April 1996". **Landis & Gyr**, Switzerland, the official printers for all P.N.G. cards, are producing a strictly limited printing of only **600** phonecards. This special card deserves to be the **sensation** of the whole show, even if collectors foolishly ignore P.N.G. cards and just purchase it for its links with the Exhibition in Australia.

P.N.G. has a strict policy of making all its cards available to the general public in P.N.G. at face value and collectors overseas and therefore 250 of these cards will remain home for this purpose. **Only 350 of these cards will be on sale at the show for \$25.00 each.**

This card must not be associated with Custom or Private cards. P.N.G. Telikom does not produce private cards and has no intention of ever doing so! Whilst some stamp collectors may see a similarity with the recent local overprints of the same Birds of Paradise set, it is a pure coincidence. It is not a restricted local overprint job!

The full Birds of Paradise phonecard set - K20, *Paradisea guilielmi*; K20, *Parotia carolae*; K10, *Cicinnurus regius*; K10, *Manucodia chalybata* - was issued in December 1995, in quantities of only 2000 of each value. These cards are selling steadily with nearly half already sold to local and overseas demands.

It is hoped that by attending this show, P.N.G. Telikom can attract more collectors in the Australasian area, which has surprisingly shunned its closest neighbour. Indeed most of the collectors of P.N.G. phonecards come from South East Asia and to a lesser degree, Europe and America with Australians almost non-existent. It is time for Australian collectors to see for themselves the tremendous attractions of P.N.G. cards and there will be **no better time than at AusCard '96.**

P.N.G. Telikom will be **bringing along** all the available sets for 1995 and 1996 from Peter ToRot (Jan. 1995), to the latest Milne Bay set and the exciting Pepsi Cola set. The full list of sets available is:-

In view of the appeal of Coca-Cola phonecards, the **Pepsi Cola** set is particularly interesting. The four images represent the four main regions of P.N.G. - Momase, Southern, Highlands and Islands. The local S.P. Brewery Company producing Pepsi, is conscious of its rival Coca-Cola product and feels that with the widespread use of phonecards, it is an excellent form of advertising. The local manager told me that he wasn't one bit interested in any overseas phonecard market. That makes a pleasant change! They have just started offering **free** Pepsi cards in competitions on the local Port Moresby radio station, so they are not going to last very long.

These prices are actually cheaper than if purchased direct from Telikom in Port Moresby and represent an opportunity to purchase a third of all the cards issued. **An opportunity not to be missed!**

Go along and visit Jerry Damoi and Simon Koima at the Telikom stand as well as view their display and think seriously about buying the lot! The cards can be purchased by cash or with the usual bank cards, in Australian dollars. Telikom are taking along what they think will be adequate supplies of these sets but an upsurge of interest at the show could easily see some sets **selling out** early - so be warned!

A final word about the quantities of recent cards. The latest sets are being produced in much smaller numbers than most of the early sets, which all sold out long ago, eg., Ela beach (K20) 6,200, S.P. Games (K10) 20,000, Haus P.T.C. (K20) 7,000, etc. I would forecast that all these current sets will be completely or partially sold out by the end of the year, especially with the local expansion of Cardphones throughout Papua New Guinea.



During a visit to Sydney in January, I called in on most of the shop dealers only to find that nobody had any P.N.G. cards, except for a few odd singles. I found one K5 Ela Beach card, mint, which I eagerly snapped up for \$20. I was told by most dealers that they hadn't any P.N.G. cards because there was no demand and yet all spoke pessimistically about the Australian phonecard market!! Well, I know where I'm going to spend my money!

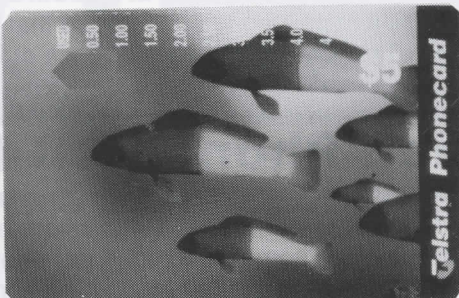
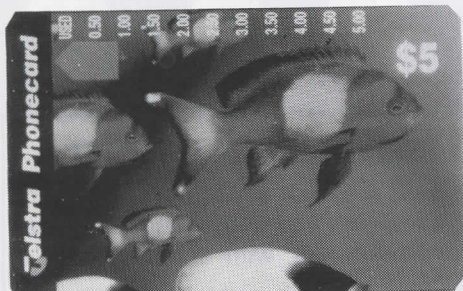

# VISA Cash Collector Services at AusCard '96

VISA Cash Collector Services will have a major presence at AusCard '96. Since the launch of VISA Cash two issues have been released.

The first was the **Asia Pacific Conference** pack which is very rare as 800 of the 1000 cards printed were put into folders and given away to the delegates of the Conference. Phonecard Advertising and Collector Services (PACS), acting on behalf of Visa International, have ensured that 120 of the remaining 200 sets were sent out to individual collectors at issue price - \$49.50! This has been done through a competition draw following an advertisement in the March issue of APM.

The second, the Worldwide Public Launch, **Gold Coast** set, contains the \$5.00, \$20.00 and \$50.00 VISA Cash cards. These will become an important series as they represent the first Official Visa Cash series produced. **These will be available at AusCard '96.**

During the first two weeks of April 1996, another important milestone will occur. Visa will launch what is believed to be the first "closed user group" stored value cards ever produced. These cards will still have the capacity of being used in Coca-Cola vending machines, McDonalds restaurants and Telstra payphones which have VISA Cash compatibility, but will be used in very high profile Theme Parks on the Gold Coast.

VISA Cash Collector Services expects to **have these cards** in both loose and Limited Edition packs **available at AusCard '96.** They also hope to have a VISA Cash compatible payphone available so that people who visit AusCard '96 may experience 'first hand' the electronic cash of the future.

## The Australian Phonecard Dealers Assoc.

The Australian Phonecard Dealers Association (APDA) was incorporated on the 19th of October 1995, and the Annual General Meeting was held on 4 November 1995, where an executive and committee was voted in unanimously. The Assoc. currently has some 20 prominent, financial members, with another batch of applications to be decided upon at the next committee meeting in April '96.

The increase in APDA members (the Assoc. has strict membership guidelines), is testimony to a growing hobby both in Australia and worldwide. APDA members are committed to a fair and honest deal for the public, keeping informed of developments in the hobby and observing the Rules and Regulations of the APDA.

A primary aim of the APDA is to promote the hobby of telephone card collecting and in raising awareness of this in the general community and to this end the executive committee and all APDA members are committed to:-

- (a) Help and assist any collector groups/clubs requiring assistance;
- (b) Sharing of information within the Association's membership, telephone card issuing authorities and collector groups;
- (c) Liaise with Telstra etc., on relevant issues, images on cards, collector print runs, etc.
- (d) A high ethical business relationship in fair pricing, quality of stock, honest advertising, etc.

To this end the executive committee has already met several times, both formally and informally and with Telstra on a formal basis, to further the hobby on an industry wide basis.

The priority of the APDA in the coming months is to consolidate the current collector base, thought to be around 3000, and promote publicity in the collectable value of phonecards (both as an aesthetic hobby and monetary) in the larger term now that most of the 'speculators' have left.

# THE WORLD OF COCA-COLA PHONECARDS

by Don Hill Pt 4.

This last article focuses on the USA which was one of the last countries in the world to implement phonecard technology but has the greatest number of telcos in any country!

Coca-Cola phonecards from the USA fall into three categories.

1. Cards produced by a telco for an event which is sponsored by Coca-Cola and so the card features the Coke logo.
2. Cards produced by Coca-Cola themselves and sold at face value somewhere or other.
3. Cards produced to be sold as Custom cards.

Many phonecards have been produced in the USA and a particular company called **HT Technologies** have produced a very large number of these event cards. Most feature a coke symbol (usually a bottle cap logo) in one corner of the card. These cards are relatively cheap and can be obtained for around \$15 each.



Coca-Cola themselves have produced a series of cards in folders called the **"World of Coca-Cola"** which are sold at the Atlanta headquarters. Five have been issued to date with a sixth due out shortly. Naturally they are called 'World of Coca-Cola numbers 1 to 6'. Each pack was issued in a quantity of 2,500, except for the second pack which had 5,000 produced.

These cards are not, as one might expect, in the second category above but are actually Custom cards produced and sold through Coke's headquarters in Atlanta. This series ceased production after a licence was issued by Coca-Cola to a company called **Scoreboard** for the manufacture of trading cards.

Scoreboard have issued a lot of phonecards in their first attempt! A **50 card set** of \$2 cards was issued along with a \$5 card set of 10 cards, as well as a \$10 card set of 10 cards, as well as a \$25 card set of 10 cards!!

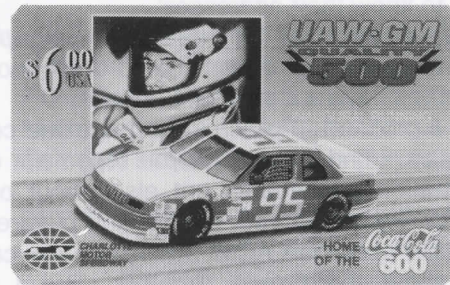
The cards were all inserted into the trading card packs containing a \$2 card and the other cards being randomly placed amongst the packs less frequently.

Two other sets were produced around this time. One features three cards with Coke images from Germany, Japan and the USA, which come in a folder, whilst the other features a Santa set of five cards with varying amounts of phone time from 3 minutes to 120 minutes.

Some cards have been produced and sold at face value or given away. **Smiths Crisps** have produced several cards and these have 'nice old pictures' on the designs.

Several 'joint issues' have been produced which, for example, feature **Coke logos** and **McDonalds logos**. These are very popular due in part because McDonalds cards are collected almost as much as Coke in the USA.

The USA cards are attractive and it is possible to ignore (say) the 'sponsor cards' to limit the overall collection, but America being America, it is hard to predict how many will emerge in the future. Still, being a thematic based form of collecting one can always leave one out and still have a nice collection!

Later I found out that the Australian Telecom (Telstra) has a Collector Service where you can buy phonecards for the original price (face value). I came to know that also some other telephone companies in the world have such a collector service.

Besides this, there are also some local dealers who offer phonecards for a relative low price. The only problem is to know their addresses'.

Up to now I don't know any dealer in Singapore, Thailand, Hong Kong or Japan. I also don't know if these countries have a Collector Service.

I think this a problem in which your magazine could help a little bit. I find it nice that you report not only about Australian phonecards but also about other countries. Very nice are your reports and pictures in your last issue about the ACMI and AmeriVox cards and also about the Czech Republic, Brazil and Thailand. Unfortunately, you don't give any hint where I can purchase these cards.

It would be nice and helpful if you would name the address of the Collector Service and other sources of supply.

It is a fact that phonecard collecting is a hobby which is not very popular yet. In my neighbourhood there are people who have never held a phonecard in their hands. However, when I talk to them about my hobby and show them my phonecard albums, they are also very interested and they find it great!

That shows that phonecard collectors should not be shy to tell everybody about their nice hobby.

I trust that one day this hobby will be as popular as stamp collecting.

When one sees the beautiful cards of flora and fauna from overseas I wonder who the brains are at Telstra who pick half of the ugly trash that's coming out.... each state has each year a major Agricultural Show - why not have a display stand at each such show, either organised by Telstra or a collection of dealers, thousands of people go to them - hand out sample bags with literature, used phonecards, etc. and even issue a special issue phonecard".

"It must be said that it is the younger generation that will ultimately decide whether the hobby will live and thrive and so it is to this group that a good percentage of advertising must be directed, even if this should mean more freebies at fairs with a topic on the cards that appeals to the young.... it would also help if dealers were to offer starter packs of used cards at a reduced rate, this could bring future rewards of having a client list, etc."

"My husband and I do a lot of 'caravanning'. Caravan Park phone boxes are excellent sources for phonecards. 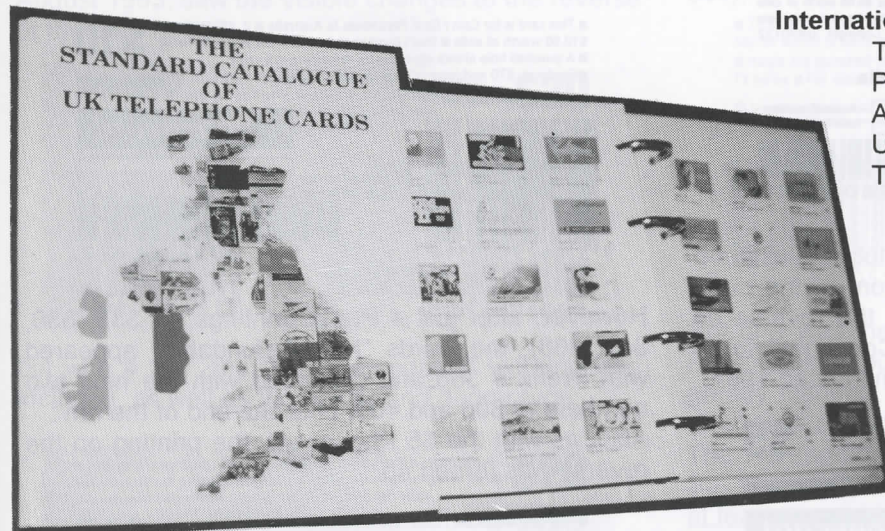
# The Standard Catalogue of UK Telephone Cards

In late 1994, 'The Telephone Card Catalogue Co.' published an initial print run of 5000 copies of 'The Standard Catalogue of UK Telephone Cards'.

Since this initial print run (of which nearly all copies sold out in advance of issue date) a second print run was undertaken, together with the printing of two **Updates** for the Catalogue - the first issued in May 1995 and the second in December 1995 (the latter containing a review of all prices for all cards - not just for those issued since the Catalogue was first released).

The next Supplement (**Update No. 3**) is due for publication in **May** of this year.

The Catalogue is in **A5 loose leaf format**, with a laminated textured binder illustrating a map of the UK made up of Telephone Cards.



At the time the Catalogue was conceived, the ring binder was produced with sufficient dimensions to allow for the inclusion of all British cards available at that time.

Due to the preponderance of new card issues, the dimensions of the original binder may be proving limited. **Extra binders** are available from both the Australian distributor for the Catalogue or from The Telephone Card Catalogue Co, itself (see next column).

Every known card is illustrated in the Catalogue and its Updates, and in addition, the catalogue contains:

- . An introduction to the Telephone Card Catalogue Co., the terminology used and the mechanisms by which the cards are catalogued and priced.
- . Full colour illustrations on 150g paper of all the UK Telecom, with 15 cards per page and two lines of descriptive text below each card.
- . Technical information, giving, in a standard format: Title, Catalogue No., Number of cards issued, known Control Numbers and reported varieties and errors.
- . Valuations based on current market prices allowing for competitive variations.

The **Telephone Card Catalogue Co.** is a co-operative initiative involving most of the UK's leading experts on Telephone Cards. As such it is the cumulative product of much dedication and commitment by those already within the hobby, for the benefit of others and for the future generations of new collectors.

# THE TOURIST GENERIC SERIES

## Collecting on a Simplified Basis

For the specialist prefix number collector, this series can be overwhelming! For the \$5 Opera House/Bridge there are 28 numbers, for the \$10 Roo/Uluru there are 16, for the \$20 Great Barrier Reef there are 10, and for the \$50 Koala there are now 4 cards - a stunning total of 58 cards altogether!!

For the simplified series, there are basically 8 cards to collect - the "Old Logo" and the "New Logo" in each of the four values.

However, there is a much more interesting way to collect these cards; by taking into account printing variations on the reverse of the card. These largely concern the use of the words "Non-refundable".

### The \$5 Opera House/Bridge

The "Old Logo" had the I.D. # Copyright G930112 and showed absolutely no variations in wording during the printing of its 16 serial numbers from February 1993.

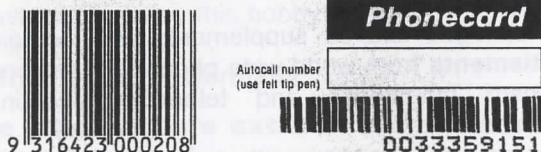

In August of 1993, the "New Logo" not only ushered in the new Telecom Logo on the front of the card, but saw some printing changes on the reverse as well, with the deletion of the word "Copyright", to be replaced with Telstra Corporation Limited 1991.

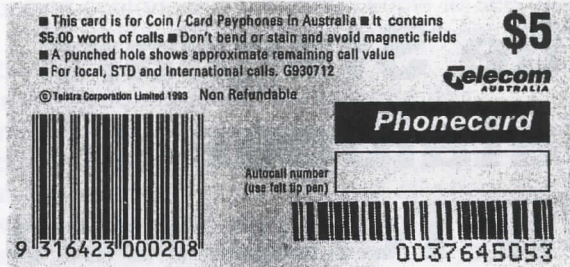

The I.D. # became G930712 and the general layout of the reverse is improved, with a much larger \$5. This basic design was maintained for 5 prints of the "New Logo" (# 333, 334, 339, 340, 341), but when Prefix # 376 arrived, the words "Non Refundable" had been added and the small type made bolder. This persisted for the next 6 prefixes.

### The \$10 Kangaroo/Uluru

Like its \$5 counterpart, the \$10 "Old Logo" showed no variations whatsoever for its 9 prefix numbers. The I.D. number was Copyright G930123a and was first issued in February 1993.

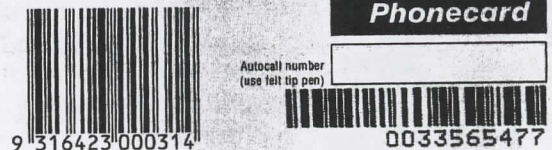

Once again, in August 1993, the "New Logo" saw changes to the reverse of the card as well, with the deletion of the word "Copyright" and the addition of Telstra Corporation Limited 1993. The I.D. number became G930723a.

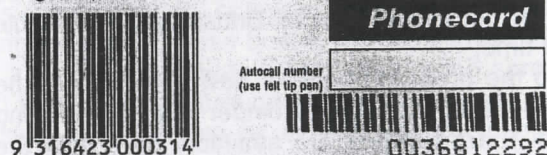

### The \$20 Great Barrier Reef

This series is unique in that two very different basic variations occur with the "Old Logo", as initially, the

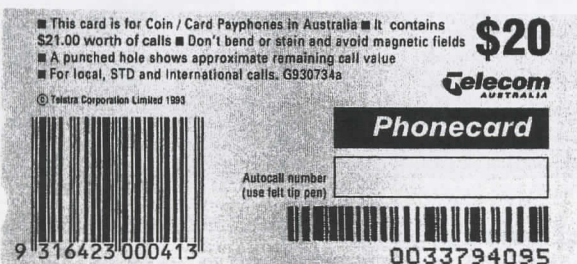
I.D. # was printed without the word Copyright (on Prefix numbers 251, 252, 253, 256). In other words, the early \$20 cards printed from February 1993 simply had the I.D. G930134a.



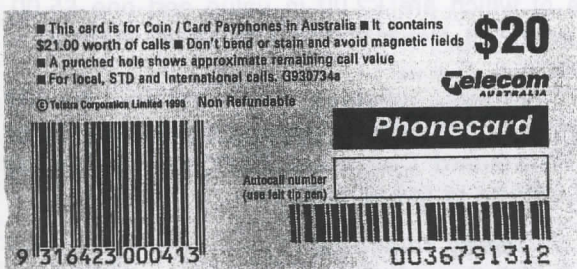
With Prefix # 273, the word "Copyright" was added, to make the wording "Copyright G930134a". (Readers are referred to APM October 1995, Vol. 3 No. 10 for information on the 284 No Copyright error).



Once again, the introduction of the "New Logo" in August 1993, saw the visible changes to the reverse of the card (# 337),



but with # 367, the "Non Refundable" wording was included, as well as the bolder and darker type.



The I.D. number was now simply G930734a for both "New Logo" varieties.

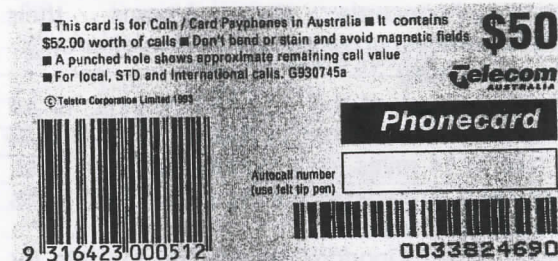
As only 80,000 were printed of Prefix # 367, it makes it one of the more difficult cards to collect in the \$20 Barrier Reef series.

## The \$50 Koala

The card has always been difficult to obtain for most collectors, once again appearing as the "Old Logo" in February 1993 as Copyright G930145a (Prefix # 271).



The August 1993 "New Logo" had simply G930745a and the addition of Telstra Corporation Limited 1993. The Prefix number was 338.



A remarkable change then occurred with the last two printings of the \$50 Koala bearing the entirely new I.D. # G952015a (applies to Prefixes # 837 and 941).



Not only was there bolder type and the words "Non Refundable", but the directions for usage were greatly clarified to state:- "Holes are punched only after 10% of value is used. Maximum of 11 holes". The TM trademark was also included.

So, for the \$50 Tourist Generic, there are certainly at least three cards to collect at this stage:-

- Old Logo I.D. # G9301145a
- New Logo I.D. # G730745a
- New Logo I.D. # G952015a

It is interesting to speculate as to whether Telstra will bring out a new I.D. number if the \$50 Koala is to be continued.

The letter "G" originally stood for Generic, but now stands for Gift Card. It thus makes the \$50 Koala G952015a the **only card in general circulation which is carrying the 'wrong' I.D. Code** - it is certainly not a Gift Card!!

# JERSEY TELECOMS

## Phonocard Collectors Club

An initial article featuring the phonocards of Jersey Telecoms (Nov. '95 APM) drew some interest and requests from readers, for further information about Jersey's cards.

I have recently received a copy of Jersey Telecoms first "Collectors Club Newsletter" and brochure "A Guide to Jersey Phonocard Collecting", which contains much of interest.

Jersey Telecoms has just launched their Collectors Club which is designed to keep collectors informed on current and future phonocard issues. The Club caters for those who may want to receive Jersey Telecoms phonocards, their Albums, their Presentation Packs, or simply their Newsletter only.

### Where is Jersey

Jersey, the largest of the Channel Islands, is 45 miles square. It is situated in the Bay of Mont St Michel, and is 14 miles from Normandy in the East, 30 miles from Brittany in the South and 90 miles from England in the North.

Whilst the United Kingdom remains responsible for the Island's defence and International relations, Jersey is self governing by the States of Jersey.

Jersey Telecoms is the **complete** telecommunications network provider for the island and is wholly owned by the States of Jersey.

Jersey Telecoms has been producing phonocards since **1988**, and use the **Magnetic Strip** which are £2.00 and £5.00 value. Since the introduction of cardphones, the Island has released **127 different cards**, 23 of which have been issued as sets. All phonocards are based on local themes, and where possible, are commissioned by Jersey artists and photographers.

The smallest print run of cards produced is 5000, but on average, Jersey prints 20,000 of each design, usually with a face value of £2.00 but sometimes £5.00. Issues total **seven sets** per year made up of 4 - 6 cards, except for special editions such as "The 50th Anniversary of the Liberation of Jersey" set issued in 1995, and "The Island Games" set to be issued in 1997 to mark the occasion of the games being held in Jersey.

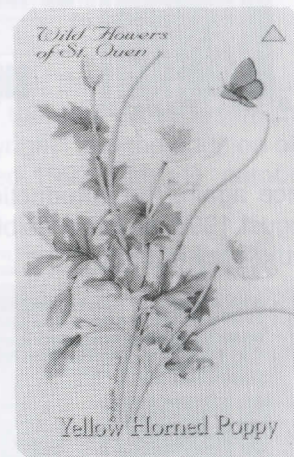
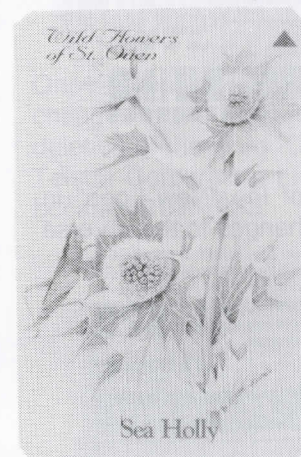
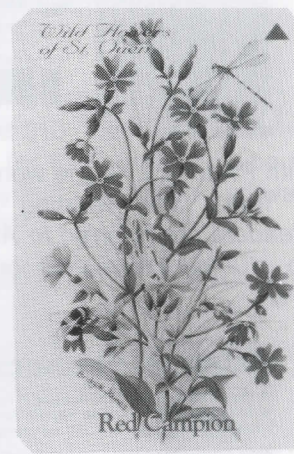
Jersey also produces a number of promotional phonocards in addition to the yearly issue as above. All of Jersey Telecoms cards are available to collect as single cards, in sets, to put in the Jersey Telecoms Phonocard Album, and as limited edition collectors packs.

The first issue of 1996 was released on 22 January and is made up of four £2.00 cards; 20,000 of each

issued. Each card features a local wild flower superbly illustrated by Bridgette James.

In recognition of the bravery and courage shown by Jersey's lifeboat crews, Jersey Telecoms has produced this dramatic set of four phonocards which were released on 28 March 1996. The cards, three of which are £2.00 in value and one £5.00, feature the St. Helier and St. Catherine's lifeboats in action.
